For those of you who have a hard time finding larger size women's shoes, there is GOOD NEWS. Payless Shoes have always carried size 11 and but had a small selection. Now, they have suddenly tripled their 12, selections with many styles, colors and heel heights. In fact the new store downtown, has an entire aisle of size 11, 1/2 an aisle of size 12, and even 4 or 5 rows of size 13. When on sale, most styles are available for \$10 to \$12. A real bargain when you think about how many people pay \$35 and more for catalog shoes which can't be returned if they don't fit.

Here's a little tip. If you sometimes feel conspicuous standing in front of size 11 or 12 shoes, while you make up your mind about a selection, I suggest you go look at (let's say) size 7. Look all you want. When you find one you like, there is a Code Number on the box. Once you have this number and color you can go to the larger size and in a few seconds check both the open and the closed boxes.

If they don't have it in the larger size there are 5 Payless Shoe Source Stores in the greater Cincinnati Area. With the number in one hand and a phone in the other you can check to see if any of the stores carry it. Not all stores have the same shoes because a computer tells them what shoe should be most popular in a given area. They are then sent where they sell the best. I have found the downtown store to be the best.

Unfortunately, if no store has it in stock, they won't order it, but they all get new shipment once a week. (See Around Town for Location)
