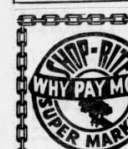

Disappointed

BORDENTOWN — "It's only \$25,000," said the New York lottery winner. "Maybe it'll be \$100,000 or something bigger. It would be something."

He and Mrs. Arthur Hawley of 129 Central Avenue are richer today but Hawley was not excited. "I guess I'll use the money for a haircut," he said.

Hawley learned that he was on the list of possible winners early this week. "I waited it out for two days waiting to hear the results," he said.

Hawley was notified of his good fortune by a phone call from a Times reporter at the Kramer Trenton Company where he has worked for 40 years. Asked how his wife Genevieve would respond to the news, Hawley said, "I think she's already gone to Dunham's to charge something."

Hawley did not appear happy about winning. "We've got a lot of bills... a mortgage. These things are a lot of money," he said.

His wife was more enthusiastic. "It's a windfall. Just unbelievable," she said.

Larry B. Larson of Spokane, Wash., a 39-year-old Army medic, says, "Saving a man's life is the greatest possible satisfaction." Larson has just returned from 13 months in Vietnam where he won the Silver Star, the Bronze Star, the Army Commendation Medal, the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry, three Purple Hearts and three campaign ribbons.

Under an agreement announced last week by U.S. Secretary of Defense Clark M. Clifford, Hanoi's negotiators in Paris implied the shelling of South Vietnam's cities would stop in line with the bombing halt.

Wednesday the Saigon government said it had protested to the International Control Commission the continued shelling of cities in violation of the Paris understanding.

"Right now this is good news, but I've got some bad news coming up and I don't want any of this publicity," Hawley said impatiently.

\$100,000 Bill Means Trouble

BOSTON (AP) — A \$100,000 bill can get you into trouble, said William J. McLaughlin, 41, of Worcester.

McLaughlin was convicted in U.S. District Court Wednesday of illegal transportation of a \$100,000 bill stolen from a New York brokerage firm. He was arrested when he tried to change the bill in a Worcester bank.

Sentencing was set for Dec. 9.

Bills of such large denomination are treasury notes, ordinarily used only by bankers and banks for transactions with each other.

Red Shells Rip S. Viet Coast City

SAGON (UPI) — Communist guns bombarded Hoi An in the coastal shelling of a South Vietnamese city since the bombing of North Vietnam stopped Nov. 1, U.S. spokesmen said today. A South Vietnamese general forecast a new Red offensive.

Two sudden barrages into Hoi An on Wednesday slammed into a hotel, the central market place and a street crowded with home-bound school children. Officials said two persons died and 27 were wounded, 19 of them youngsters.

Gen. Do Cao Tri, South Vietnamese commander of the provinces around Saigon, said in Hoi An today the Communists are now in hiding, regrouping and refitting for a winter-spring offensive.

"We are confident their units will become active again once they are refitted and regrouped," he said. Allied troops found two big arms caches on Saigon's doorstep Wednesday, one of them with 1,000 grenades.

Hoi An, 200 miles north of Saigon and 20 miles south of Da Nang, is in the middle of a Communist buildup that has tied allied soldiers during the weekend and lost more than 500 men.

It was one of two major South Vietnamese cities shellings of Wednesday and today. A Viet Cong mortar barrage caused light damage and casualties in My Tho, second largest city in the Mekong Delta, spokesmen said.

In Saigon, U.S. Ambassador Ellsworth Barker met for the first time in nearly a week with President Nguyen Van Thieu and a speculation among diplomats in Paris that South Vietnam was almost ready to join the Paris talks.

U.S. headquarters announced, meantime, that American battle deaths last week dropped to their lowest in five weeks. The casualty report showed 17 U.S. dead and 1,021 wounded.

American headquarters said it lost 128 men killed — the lowest in three weeks and 164 wounded — in the last three weeks. The report showed 1,338, an increase of 227 over the previous week.

In addition, the Reds slammed the U.S. Air Force base at Pleiku in the Central Highlands and the headquarters of the U.S. 1st Air Cavalry Division 20 miles north of Saigon.

American headquarters described damage and casualties at both bases as "light."

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Showers and snow flurries are predicted over the Northwestern United States Thursday night, while warmer temperatures will move over the lower Mississippi Valley. Temperatures will moderate over the central plains with little temperature change elsewhere.

Sun To Bring Brief Warmth

Sunny and slightly warmer weather — due to stay at least through tomorrow — moved into the area today, with afternoon high temperatures in the upper 40s.

Tonight will be partly cloudy, low in the mid-30s.

Tomorrow is to be fair and milder with the high in the 40s, says Trenton meteorologist Jim Malinsky.

At the shore, winds from the southwest, at 10 to 20 knots, were expected to remain at the same speed night and become westerly to northwesterly at 10 to 20 knots tomorrow.

Weather at the shore is expected to become increasingly cloudy later today and cloudy tonight, but will clear by tomorrow.
