Reward Posted For Information in Mysterious Death of Famous Transvestite

New York City, NY. The New York City Gay and Lesbian Anti-Violence Project today posted a \$2,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of any individual in connection with the death of Marsha P. Johnson. Marsha was a well-known and respected transvestite in the Village area. She was a survivor of the 1969 Stonewall Riots, which sparked the modern gay/lesbian rights movement.

Marsha's body was found floating in the Hudson River on July 6, 1992. Because of a number of anti-gay incidents in the West Village around July 4, including one incident in which a person was pushed into the river by a gang of youths, the Project believes that foul play cannot be ruled out. The Project hopes that the reward will lead additional persons to come forward.
