Just before the last meeting, I received a call from Ed, owner of "The Hangout". He informed me that as of June 1 the Hangout would change names to "The Place" and would no longer be a GAY bar. This presented us with the problem of finding a new meeting place. As discussed earlier it was decided to have an outdoor picnic for June and try to find a place for July.

The most reasonable idea was to try to find a motel, in the area, and rent a room. Dee was to look into that possibility. The biggest objection I have to that is paying for it. With attendance as flexible and sporadic as it is, one way to guarantee that we could pay for the room would be to say that the cost gets split among everyone there. If the cost is \$50 and 50 people are there it cost \$1 each. If only two people are there it cost \$25 each. I don't find that to be a fair solution. Another way would be to pay in advance. The money collect at the meeting pays for the next month. If there is not enough money there is no meeting.

The problem with any of these solutions is we are making it more expensive to be a crossdresser. Whether you spent money for clothes or for electrolysis most of us spend far to much money on other things involved with who we are. We should not have to spend a lot more money just to meet with friends.

As it now stands, Ed has decided not to change. "The Hangout (now The Place) will continue to be our meeting place. The July meeting will once again be held there. This however, should be viewed as a temporary solution to our problem. We need to begin looking for alternatives. If anyone has a suggestion PLEASE let me know. I am pleased to announce the formation of the Midwest Ohio Support Group. We are a transsexual support group only. We were formed to help try and meet some of the specialized needs of the transsexual. Because the rehabilitative process is so long and complex, a support group is almost a necessary requisite. We have a modest library of books, articles, and bibliographies. We also can supply information on helping professionals in the local area that are sympathetic with the transsexual's plight – doctors, lawyers, community mental health centers, psychologists, electrologist, and cosmotologists. In addition to these resources, we have the experiences of our members to draw upon.

Our group meets on the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of each month, at 6:30 pm – ?. With personal security of all members in mind, new members must undergo a screening. They must either meet me or one of the other group members prior to coming to a support meeting.

The new phone has helped to reach new people we otherwise may not have been in touch with. Some have called just to talk, no names, no numbers. Others have requested more information. Each week when the "Downtowner" comes out I get about 3 or 4 calls. I feel it is well worth the effort and money we have put into it.

Finally, we say good-bye to a friend. Dr. George Brown is being shipped off to San Antonio, Texas. We thank him for his love, support and the time he has given to both the main group and the mate support group. Linda will continue to work with us until the fall, when she too will be moving. We hope that our sisters in Boulton & Park Cultural Society will be able to get with him, and make him feel right at home.
