Can She Love Him In Women's Clothes?

QUESTION: My husband is a transvestite. He never told me until three years ago, after 16 years of marriage. We have two boys, ages 9 and I 1. The boys mean the world to us, and the last thing we want to do is hurt them with a divorce.

My husband wants me to accept his dressing and find him attractive dressed in women's clothing and lingerie. He says that if I can't, our marriage will end when our youngest son turns 18. Although I love my husband and want him to be happy, I cannot feel happy for myself.

He says he needs to wear something feminine in order to feel sexy and emotionally ally free. Without it, he's uninterested and finds sex boring. (Our sex life for the first 16 years was unfulfilling; I used to blame myself for his lack of passion.) When he feels that I'm becoming more accepting, he's very affectionate. When I'm less so, he becomes angry and highly critical of me. Most of the time, he's in neutral. We have been to counselors and psychologists, but nothing solves our problems. All he wants, he says, is for me to like him in women's clothes.


How can I learn to do this? He has tried to tone down his bedtime attire, but I still feel very sad and somewhat repulsed. We are both depressed. My husband says it's all up to me now. Can a wife learn to find her husband sexy and desirable in women's clothing when she misses the look and feel of him without?

ANSWER: Maybe. It's certainly possible for a highly motivated woman to come to accept her husband's crossdressing (there are a number of couples and wives-only support groups). Whether or not that acceptance can include romantic passion is something else,- passion is not the product of mere good will and certainly the product of a need to please an angry, threatening partner.

Everyone has his or her "bottom line:' Your husband knows his cross-dressing" is even more central to him than the marriage. It doesn't mean that he doesn't love you or that you've failed him somehow. He has discovered something powerful about himself and hopes that you can it. Maybe you can, maybe you can't. You didn't sign on, 19 years ago, to be with a man who makes love to you while wearing woman's underwear and who feels "most himself". You have to, decide what your needs are and how well he meets them emotionally and physically.

It may be sadly, that what you need and what he needs are not the same thing. This is no different, on one level. than one partner becoming suddenly devout(in a marriage of atheists), or Contd
