NEW FOR 1998 - Mini Programs

Stepping Further Out - The Stepping Out Program, conducted by Niela Miller and associates, has been primarily directed to the concerns of the First Timers. This program will continue in 1998 and is being expanded to include "Stepping Further Out" for those going more public.

Many experienced cross dressers, are finding that they enjoy the freedom of going where they want to, when they want, in their gender presentation of choice. This program will enable participants to hear from professionals and "open" cross gendered persons. How their lifestyle have worked out, what complications, risks, and rewards they find as a transgendered individual living in the mainstream.

Getting to Know our FtM Brothers - This new Mini-program is lead by Mykael Hawley of IFGE with several of his friends. We will hear the FtM point of view of the TG phenomena in a panel discussion on Monday evening at the Diversity Dinner and in a workshop on Tuesday. One of the goals of the workshop will be to discuss and develop strategy for mutual inclusion and cooperation between the CD, MtF, and FtM communities. This workshop agenda brings together the spectrums of transgender activities and allows all to participate and speak about our communities growth.

Mainstream Religion - A burning issue for many in the TG community at this time, is the question of being active and out in their main stream religions. We are indeed fortunate to have Erin Swenson, well known Presbyterian Pastor, as a member of FF'98 staff who, besides assisting in the office, will lead special workshops in this area. Later in the week, Erin will be joined by Laurie Auffant, Unitarian Minister in Arlington, MA, who will present workshops on Saturday and help organize and lead a Sunday service at the Provincetown Meeting House (Universalist Unitarian) on our last Sunday in Provincetown, October 25. Plan to stay for this exciting event. Alison Laing says: "If you have the least bit of a spark of spirituality in your soul, this event should set it aflame again!" It should be noted that all religious backgrounds are welcomed at the UU and at these workshops. Gender preference has no religious context, it is only your own spirit which asks for the guidance and caring that religions offer and, thus, all are encouraged to attend.

Guests have a variety of amenities not normally found in Cape Cod Inns. For those used to working out, a gym, steam room, and sauna will keep you trim. Bring your bathing suit as there are two large outdoor jacuzzis to revitalize those tired feet at the end of a long day of walking and evening of dancing.

A Sampling of New Programs for 1998

Diane Ellaborn - Luncheon - CD Couples - Issues and Conflict Resolution

This luncheon will investigate the difficulties couples have in communications, from avoiding issues in an attempt to keep the peace to how-to-talk about issues without escalating to out-of-control situations. A model of "fighting fair", and methods of conflict resolution will be introduced to the attendees. (workshop to follow)

There will be afternoon workshop for couples in which Transgender individuals will form one group and the partners will form another. Each group will discuss; areas of conflict for couples, what's worked and what has not, ways to resolve conflict, and new models of conflict resolution. Finally the two groups will reunite to share insights and new ideas for conflict resolution.

Niela Miller - Awakening/Expressing the Feminine Soul

How do we find the beauty, feelings, and potential inside us and bring it out into the world? How do we overcome conditioning which has prevented us from "stepping out" with the best, most human parts of ourselves?

Through story telling, art, movement, singing and speaking from the heart, we will move through these obstacles to create a loving and joyful experience so important to the feminine soul.

Dr. Richard Docter - Are there common "stages" of cross dressing?

How many stages involve various challenges to success as a cross dresser? What stages are most commonly described? does revealing yourself to others play a major part? What is the impact of aging on cross dressing? Is there anything especially useful or not useful about the "stages in your experience?

Dr. Richard Docter will discuss these and other facets of the cross dressing phemomina with fan Fair participanbts. Dr. Docter, Professor of Psychology at California State University has attended numerious Fantasia Fairs and bring a wealth of information to his programs.

Diane Ellaborn - Saying Good-bye/ The day after - (2 hr workshop)

This workshop will focus on saying good-bye and how to handle the after Fair blues that most participants feel. How to handle the loss of connections formed at FF. How to establish, maintain and expand your support network from home, how to reenter the real world, how to talk to partners, friends, and family about the FF experience and how to integrate your male/female sides back in the "straight world".

Betty Ann Lind - Former Fantasia Fair Director dies after a long illness. Betty Ann Lind, one of the marvelous people who helped build and establish Fanstasia Fair and had been involved for many years in FI shows around the country, passed on after suffering a stroke. Her caring for this community could only be partially recognized by the many awards she had received. Betty Ann was a true lady in all respects and her direction and strength helped so many at Fan Fair.


Fanfair is for anyone who wants to feel what life without fear is all about. Come, join us, and share the love.
