(Can you believe him admitting they had hired no women and would love to in Jan. when her case was reviewed?)

Los Angeles--Dozens of <u>womens</u> groups picketed State Court of Appeals there protesting a decision in a rape case of a woman hitchhiker. Decision states, "...it is not unreasonable for a man who picked up a woman hitchhiker to believe the woman would consent to sexual relations."--Enough petitions are signed in Madison for our recall of Simonson & Malvina Reynolds has made a record (\$1.25 at SisterMoon) about him & our plight in the courts re: rape.

A new breast cancer test, using a substance called T-antigen injected under the skin is said to be detecting cancer in its earliest stages.

Surgical Care Blue Shield will begin paying up to \$50 to cover physician costs related to treatment of sexual assault.

The Mil. NOW Task Force on Education has asked the federal govt. to cut off 16 million dollars in federal funds to Mil. Public Schools. Why? 'Cause they are not committed to solving problems of sex discrimination & violated federal law by not submitting a report on what was done to be in accord with Title 9. Go gettum Mary!!

The 1st ten female pilots have been trained by the Air Force & will be flying cargo transports, aerial refueling tankers, training planes & weather reconnaissance.

Detroit--A 13 year old girl who likes to shoot pool has won a court ruling breaking the barrier at the local boys club. She said she did not want to join the Girls' Club 'cause all they did was sewing and cooking and she likes pool. A State agency ruled last month that 8 employers broke state law when they didn't give insurance coverage or sick leave to pregnant workers. 240 other maternity cases are still pending.

Enlarged breasts & impotency of male workers at a plant producing DES are being investigated by fed. govt. The agency wants the workers to wear special air suits. (Why not stop producing this cute little drug which is mostly used in female gynecology care as the MORNING AFTER PILL & causes CANCER.) Also used in cattle feed-thought it was banned for that? 200,000 people marched in San Francisco last month to protest the outcome of the gay rights referendum that lost in Dade County, Florida.

Ald. Robert Anderson of Mil. suggested that our city go on record against the Equal Right Amendment. Karen Lamb called him "kooky". He <u>shouted</u> at her that "because you're from the South you shouldn't come up here & tell the North how to do its business." (So much for male emotionalism.) Wash., D.C. WOW!! The govt. is opening public housing to unmarried couples living together & to homosexual couples if they can show a "stable family relationship". Under <u>new</u> regulations family consists of 2 or more persons sharing residency, whose income & resources are available to meet the family needs & who are related by <u>blood</u>, <u>marriage</u>, or evidenced a stable family relationship.

Think we'll ever read about her in <u>their</u> history books? She is presently serving as Chief of Nuclear Medicine **at** the Bronx hospital & as a Prof. at Mount Sinai School of Medicine in NY.

Ms. Anita Shelton of Wash., D.C. works for National Committee on Household Employment (NCHE). She wants to see most household workers carry a union card & work under contracts spelling out duties, pay, sick leave, retirement benefits & hospitalization. "40% of household workers are still not paid the minimum wage. Their average income is \$2,732 a year-+less than the poverty level."

Suffragist Alice Paul, a pioneer of the Women's Movement & author of the Equal Rights Amendment has died at 92. She also founded the National Women's Party & was inprisoned several times because of her work for women's rights. Jacqueline Means was ordained the Episcopal Church's 1st woman priest. It is now 6 months later & she is still without a job or parish.

The number of hysterectomies performed in Saskatchewon hospital dropped dramatically <u>after</u> a medical committee monitoring reasons for the surgery found a large percentage to be unjustified (try 23.7%)

A-323, which would revise laws regulating private sexual activities of adults, will not come up again until the Legislature meets in Sept. It is in the Leg. Joint Finance Committee right now.

Human Rights Commission (??) of Bloomington Ind. ruled same sex couples have no rights to dance with each other in local discotheques or share apartments. Jean Whitefield of England became the 1st lesbian mother there to win custody of her children. Charges of "militant lesbianism" & campaigns on women's liberation issues were used as factual evidence. The victory was due more to the fathers failure to provide a home rather than a radical change in the law's attitude. (00B)

HR 2998 is the national gay civil rights bill which would amend the <u>1964</u> Civil Rights Act by adding words "affectional or sexual preference". <u>We must</u> write the Subcommittee on Civil & Const. Rights & voice our strong support.
