To some it may have seemed as if the days March 4-9, 1987 were straight out of an Orson Wells Radio Program. To others it was like like Reading "Lost in Paradise". For everyone it was History in the making. The first TV/TS "Crossdressing" Convention landed in Chicago's Ramada O'Hare during this time and I not sure the Hotel Management will ever be the same.

Linda and I left Cincinnati around 8:45 am on Thursday and arrived in Chicago around 2:00 pm with only one stop for refreshments and on one tank of gas. We did get lost around the hotel but managed to find our way to the press room were we were politely greeted by some familiar and some not familiar faces.

We had to wait about two hours to check into a room so we went to the restaurant for a bite of lunch. Walking through the lobby two things became apparent to us, one, that some of the people were looking at us rather quizzically and two, that most of the rest of the people could care less. Those two facts helped to set me more at ease and make the weekend everything it should have been.

Everyone I met was extremely friendly and polite. The hotel personnel deserve a real round of applause for their every effort to accept us as the women we were. If any of them did have a hard time with it, it never showed. Many of the other patrons had a comment or two, but many times if we were given a chance to talk to them they went away with a better understanding of what we were about.

On the Business side the first convention went relatively smooth at least from the outside looking in. I attended the staff meetings every morning and got a view from the inside out. The staff had its share of problems. Most impressive however, was the quick way that the staff managed to handle the problems. They obviously did not wish for things to end in a mess and so they were prepared for problems. This preparation helped to keep the weekend moving and shows just how much work they put into the planning.

The first session on Friday was "Forming an Organization" and almost all other session hinged around this first theme. There were sessions on Networking, Transvestism, Transsexualism, Female Impersonators and Communications. There were a couple of sessions just for Wives and Significant Others and one that I personally got a lot from were a 4 hour session on Peer Counseling by Niela Miller.

At the Friday luncheon Dr. Roger Peo spoke to us about his vision of were we are and were we still have to go. The evening entertainment was provided by several of Chicago's own girls in a "Not so Drag" show and topped off by a late night in the "Disco" lounge.

At the Saturday luncheon, Dr. Virginia Prince gave a very moving speech about the history of Crossdressing organization since 1962 and the start of a new movement to join all aspects of crossdressing into a united front with society as our battle ground and not eachother. She called for a change in the term "Gender Dysphoria" to "Gender Euphoria" since most crossdressers are happy with themselves and their dressing. She further stated that the most fearsome enemy for all men, in our society, is their own femininity, since it is the one thing that makes them less a man. We can be proud to say, "I have met the enemy, and she is me."

Several standing ovations were given Dr. Prince both at the luncheon and later that evening when she was roasted and honored with the first "Lifetime Achievement Award". By the end of the night she was left completely speechless. Sunday morning things began to wind down, but not before Merrisa spoke to us about the plans for next years convention which is already on the way.

The weekend did turn out to be one of "Coming Together - Working Together" and our community is the better for it.

There is so much going on in the various organizations that make up the Greater Cincinnati Gay / Lesbian Coalition that the best thing to do would be to hit the highlights and put in a calendar of events so that is what I'll do.

First, in the last issue of "InnerView", I reported that Cross-Port had voted to abstain from voting on the proposed resolutions before the 6C6/LC. At the last coalition meeting the first resolution was changed by substitution to read:

Whereas gays and lesbians generally consider the legal right to make erotic choices about their own bodies precious, and Whereas many gays and lesbians consider this legal right analogous to the right of women to make choices relating to abortion, and Whereas the majority of the organizations in the GCG/LC wish to express solidarity with NOW and other pro-choice organizations, but Whereas some member organizations cannot in good conscience support this position, Be it Therefore Resolved: That dissenting organizations (such as Dignity) be specifically mentioned as dissenting whenever and wherever officers of GCG/LC discuss the pro-choice position of the coalition majority; That member organizations wishing to be listed as dissenting, so inform the officers of the coalition in writing within two months of the passage of this resolution.

After much discussion this resolution was passed. Goldie and I discussed both sides of the issue among ourselves and decided that it was in the best interest of the members to support this resolution. It was our feeling that as a crossdressering community we ask society for the same rights, namely to clothe our bodies, and in some cases to change our bodies according to our choice. No matter how each of us may feel about abortion, we must respect others rights to make that choice, even if we feel the choice is wrong. Even 6od gave us the right of free choice. Are we so great that we can take from someone what 6od has given?
