Hi girls, this is Barbara back with the insight. Ok, this month let's first take a little scenario. "Your wifejust found out about your being a crossdresser, but surprise, she did not run to the divorce lawyer, rather she accepted it with open arms. (well maybe not quite so open) She helps you with makeup, you go shopping enfemme with her, she helps you pick out clothes. SHE'S A DREAM COME TRUE. Then suddenly things don't quite seem to go so well, and one day you come home and find that she gave all your feminine clothes to the good old Salvation Army. She tells

you that if you ever do it again she will leave. That seemingly wonderful "A+" wife has become a pure B****, and a flat "F"." Why, what happened girls?

Girls we must remember that there are a number of things that a wife fears when she finds out about our crossdressing. The three most predominant are that 1) we are gay or planning a sex change, 2) that the kids will also be crossdressers, and 3) her social standing with friends family and neighbors.

Cynthia Phillips in the W.A.C.S. newsletter made mention of the fact that the one most important thing in our relationship with our wife or girlfriend is COMMUNICATIONS. But there is very serious problem to a communications with our wives, like it or not, we are men, and men do communicate different than women. This can make communications difficult with our wives. And yet a full fifty percent of communications involves LISTENING. It is very difficult for us to become mind readers, and yet we must seemingly be just that. We must not only listen to what our wives say to us, but we must also try and read her facial expressions. If we see that something bothers her we must get her to talk about it. Often times little things we do will really turn her off to our crossdressing.

Let's get some ideas of the things

that are a turn off for her. Do you come home from work and immediately change into your feminine wardrobe? Being able to dress at home is great, we have more time to be who we want to be, and it is so wonderful to be able to sleep in those beautiful gowns rather than the ugly cotton or flannel pajamas, but girls think of what signal you are giving your wife. Your wife is a heterosexual woman, SHE WANTS A MAN! While she may enjoy the company of a sister or girlfriend at times, she also wants to be in the company of a man. BALANCE in necessary girls. If we spend too much of our time enfemme, she will be quickly turned off to us. Try to limit your dressing to something that is comfortable for both of you. TALK TO HER, GET HER TO TALK TO YOU, find out what is truly comfortable FOR HER.

Here is another problem to dressing at home. What if someone comes to the door? Have you and your wife handled that problem? Also if you have children at home, what is the effect on them? OK so they understand and accept, but when can they have friends over. Children can be very cruel to one another girls, and really aren't you being cruel to your children if they can't have friends over to the house when you are at home? Setting aside one or two days a week for dressing at home still gives them times when they can have their friends over. I know from past experience that if a friend of your kids knows about your crossdressing and their parents find out it can be devastating to your child's friendship. COMMUNICATE with both your wife and your children on this matter girls.

OK, now here is another problem that sometimes occurs. You are at a lounge enfemme and a man ask you to dance. You have (you think) convinced her that you are not gay, and it is really nice when a man ask you to dance, especially when the place is a straight place rather than a gay place. And there is really no harm in a little dance, but what signal do you give to your wife? Also girls, what do you think it does to her feelings when the man asked you to dance with him rather than her? Once again COMMUNICATIONS is important.

Here is another problem girls, What does your wardrobe look like, what does her wardrobe look like? When you buy yourself a new dress, do you think of her and buy her a new dress also? She has helped you to look as feminine as you can, but do you do the same for her? I know girls, all to often I have heard my wife say that I was prettier than she was, and all too often I failed to recognize that it was a cry from her, a cry for me to remind her that she was pretty to me. And all to often I know I had gone out and bought myself a new dress or a new pair of shoes, with nothing for her. She is still hurting that I had forgotten all about her birthday this year. It is the little things like these that will turn her off to us girls. Don't try and compete with her girls. This is a big turnoff for her. Looking pretty is very important to your wife also. It is bad enough that she must compete with other women, but now she must compete with you. Help her as she helps you. COMMUNICATE!

Shopping enfemme is also another problem girls. WHERE do you go shopping. Do you go shopping right in the town where you live? If you live in a small town this is especially bad. Many of us have gotten to the point where we do not care what people think or say, and many of us do pass, but I don't think any of us really pass 100% Sometimes we are recognized. Remember she is concerned about HER social standing with her friends, family, and neighbors. She does not want people ridiculing her, or asking her questions. Be thoughtful of her. Once again COMMUNICATE girls.

Maybe you have been reading up on hormones. Yes it would be so wonderful to have OUR OWN breast, to have a more feminine body, but what is the message that you are giving her? Huh Huh! Better can that idea girls. What do you want more her or that body.

Just as gender dysphoria can be bad for us mentally girls, so too can gender euphoria. Feeling good about ourselves is one thing girls, but when we put too much emphases on the feminine and so little on the masculine it does turn our wife off. being me does not necessarily mean being Barbara instead of Jim, but rather it means COMBINING Jim and Barbara together to make a better person out of me. As I said last month girls, there are positive and negative traits to both the masculine and the feminine. We must learn to integrate the positive feminine in our daily lives along with the positive masculine. Once again, COMMUNICATE! What are the positive traits of the masculine and the feminine that make you attractive to vour wife. Do not destroy the masculine in an attempt to become more feminine.

Girls, remember if you have that A + wife and you want to keep her an A + wife, do LISTEN to her, and do be not only as considerate of her as you are of yourself, but more considerate of her than you are of yourself. Being considerate of others is one of the most feminine qualities that we can obtain girls.

Well that is all for this month girls. Remember I love each and everyone of you. Be good to yourself, and most important girls be good to your wife. You BOTH are worth it.

"Girls will be Boys..."

[ED NOTE: the following article was sent to us by a gal from New Zealand where it appeared in a local paper]

In the battle of the sexes, a truce has been called, at least for fashion autumn/winter 1993.

Season after season magpie womenswear designers rifle every conceivable source for their ideas. This winter it is menswear that has inspired a major direction for women's fashion. Girls will be boys in anything from pin-striped trouser suits through to the flounces and frills of the Edwardian dandy.

It's a fashion lead given a feminine twist. A tailored pant suit may appear in a luscious pastel, a man-style jacket teams up with the newest long skirt, slashed to flash a length of leg. or an element of fantasy may be added by creatively accessorising with animal print pieces, a French beret, retro jewelry.

Leaner lines apply to trousers as much as jackets but women at least can indulge in more than the tapered tailored styles, their choices extended by soft wide-legged trousers a la Marlene Dietrich, jodhpurs, flares (again!) and even knitted wool jeans. Offering flexibility, tactile appeal and real comfort, wool knitwear makes a strong showing. In menswear it transcends the more traditional clothing categories. and is now deemed appropriate for city dressing through to leisurewear. This season will see women add knitted tunics, wraps, duster coats and the newest cuffed leggings to their wardrobes.

The emphasis on tailored wear and garments with more than one vocation has assured wool its place as the designer's first choice of fibers. Flexibility, subtlety, drape, durability these qualities are demanded of materials and compromise is a dirty word.

Fluid lightweight worsted wools are especially favoured, with wool/cashmere mixes and pure wools such as melton and loden figuring in generous, enveloping coats.

Jamie Elizabeth's Article

Two weeks ago I was interviewed by a student in Peace Studies from Earlham College. Somehow she got my name as a leader of the men's group at our church and wanted to know something of our focus. What were we interested in and what was our overall strategy? I had to respond that I didn't really know what our "purpose" was, but that we were simply trying to ease pain wherever we could. Since then (with Susan's help) I have been reading several very interesting books. Their titles are: Myths of Gender by Anne Fausto-Sterling/Basic Books, 1985 and Women respond to the Men's Movement, edited by Kay Leigh Hagan/Pandora, 1992. In the second book, <u>Refusing to be a Man</u>, by John Stoltenberg/Breitenbush Books, 1989 is mentioned.

In Women Respond..., several authors make it clear that there are two diverse branches to the men's movement. The first group called the "mythopoetic group" follows the ideas of Robert Bly (in Iron John) in seeking to regain the lost father through the "Wild Man." This is the group that has been getting the publicity by holding men-only meetings in the woods, by having sweat lodges, drumming, and seeking a mythical primitive self. This group emphasizes the "strong/hard man" through separation from women. In the videotape, "A Gathering of Men" Robert Bly himself talks poignantly about the longing for union with his absent father. (I have a copy for loan). In the video the emphasis seems to be on male bonding with no overt intent to exclude feminism, but several of the writers point out that this is classic patriarchy and that it is the sort of myth espoused by the Nazis.

The second group in the men's movement was described by Zsuzsanna Emese Budapest as the "Lunar Male" and in her words, "I would like to stand up for the so-called 'soft male.' I like him. And I think many women also like him. This is the Lunar Male who has found flexibility. The Lunar male knows how to wax and wane. how to grow into fullness. Lunar Males are identified with the human species as a whole, therefore women are part of them." In my own words the second (and less publicized) group in the men's movement are basically men unafraid to identify with women. They are not necessarily crossdressers, but they are concerned with the three major problems women everywhere face. These are: poverty or economic inequity, violence and intimidation (crossdressers risk some of this, too, but they can escape by a change of costume), and unequal responsibility for child care. My point is that crossdressers have some natural allies if we can measure up to their standards. I have heard us characterized as only interested in hair.

clothes, and cosmetics.

I can see that the Women's Movement also has the same two clearly separated parts. They have the "mythopoetic" attitudes in their use of the Goddess concept and in the legitimization of witches as part of their effort to rid themselves of the Patriarchy. Others like Gloria Steinem seemed to be focused on improving the whole of humanity through a more equitable sharing of power and family responsibility.

Wearing women's clothes has caused me to change in ways I had not expected. In my return to crossdressing with a more accepting partner, the eroticism has faded rather quickly and even the former overriding concern with hair, clothes, and cosmetics seems to be diminishing. I am however still stuck on the need for intimacy which to me is like dancing with my partner's spirit. Another change during this past year has been an increasing interest in political action and spiritual growth. I'm also doing more of my share of the home chores like ironing, laundry, dishwashing, and cleaning. Susan has been giving instruction on cooking but my progress has been discouragingly slow. I guess my goal is to seek personal improvement as a human through what I can learn from women. When LuAnn said we wee part of the Women's Movement, I wa a bit surprised but I have to agree, even though N.O.W. may not be ready for us, yet. I'll wait for your comments at the next meeting. -- Jamie Elizabeth PERSONAL GROWTH & SELF ESTEEM

GENDER ALLIANCE FOUNDATION MEETING N.C.G.A.

The first conference was held on April 17, 1993 at the Sheraton Inn-North in Pittsburg. I attended along with twelve other sisters representing the following

sororities:

Alpha Omega - Cleveland CCDC - Toronto CrossPort - Cincinnati Crystal Club - Columbus Erie Sisters - Erie Nu Phi Chi - Buffalo Sigma Nu Rho - Trenton Transpitt - Pittsburg

The main focus of an alliance of clubs is to foster better communication between the clubs. The alliance can provide a "clearing house" for the announcement of upcoming activities and events among the clubs. It would be the intention of an alliance to publish a fact-sheet of current events that each member club can include in its own newsletter.

Other topics discussed, where it was believed an alliance could be of benefit, were a legal referral guide listing local laws important to the community and how to deal with problems that might arise, publication of club "how-to" guides to share the wealth of experience among the clubs in areas such as speakers and hot lines, and sponsorship of a partners' group.

The foundation meeting touched on structural issues only briefly, preferring to leave the mechanics of organization up to a future meeting. Ideas that were discussed include:

-Publication of a club current events page

-Allowing inter-club visitation by all members of clubs in the alliance without restriction.

-Providing clubs alliance membership ID cards to be used as alliance and individual club member's identification.

-Each member club would have two representatives to alliance business meetings. Each member club would have one vote on alliance issues.

-The alliance would hold meetings quarterly or semi- annually. -Club dues to the alliance should be held between \$50 and \$100 per year per club. The next alliance meeting is scheduled for July 10 beginning at 12:00 noon. At this meeting the club representatives will formulate Articles of Alliance which will serve as the constitution for the alliance. The meeting is tentatively set to be held at the Sheraton Inn North Pittsburg, the same location as the foundation meeting.

Cheryl Leslie will act as alliance coordinator and serve on the alliance Panel of Representatives without representing the interests of any one member club. Details regarding the July meeting and future meetings will be issued by the alliance coordinator. The alliance currently holds about \$175 for expenses after paying for the foundation meeting. These funds were contributed by clubs participating in the meeting.

The foundation committee was unable to arrive at a suitable name for the alliance. We ask that each participating club submit a suggestion or two via their representative to the July meeting. The name need not indicate the purpose of the alliance or its geographical boundaries. Try to be as creative in naming as you can. The Panel of

Representatives will choose the name from the suggestions at the July meeting.

I feel this is a worthwhile cause. We had a very productive first meeting. The alliance being still in a formative stage, we are looking for suggestions not only for a name, but also for ideas that our sisters would like to see explored and possibly be incorporated as part of the Alliance's agenda. I would urge all of you to give this some consideration and forward your ideas to Cross-Port by June 1st so I can take them to the next meeting. The success of the Alliance could have a great impact on the future of the entire "CD" community. We need your ideas and help. Love.
