Welcome to ETVC

Who we are ... and how to find us.

ETVC (Educational TV Channel) is a social, recreational and educational support group for transvestites, transsexuals, transgenderists and their friends and/or Significant Others.

In the spring of 1982, a small group of cross-dressers and transgenderists in the San Francisco Bay area, wanting to create a safe social milieu for themselves, began getting together on a regular basis at various individuals' homes. We chose a name for our group (ETVC) and as word got around and more people started showing up at the gatherings, we established regular monthly socials at a San Francisco restaurant, the Chez Mollet. In less than a year, our "theme" parties were drawing an average of 40-60 people and ETVC had become established as one of the best places in the Bay area for TV's, TS's and TG's to go for a sociable night out.

Starting in 1983, we began to adopt a set of bylaws to provide a formal structure for the group. Under these Bylaws, ETVC is a membership organization (although nonmembers who share our interests are welcome to attend) wherein responsibility for coordinating its activities rests with a 5-member Executive Committee.

Since we exist to help meet the needs of TV's, TS's and TG's, we are delighted to welcome new people who share our interests to any of our regular meetings which take place the last Thursday of every month at the Chez Mollet restaurant, 527 Bryant St., San Francisco, CA from 8 pm to 12 midnight. Their specialty is French cuisine and reservations are usually advisable. Directions to the Chez Mollet are on the back.

We would like to encourage all our friends, new and old, to become members of ETVC. On the reverse is a mail-in membership form for your convenience. Anyone can also become a member at the door on the night of any ETVC function. Reprinted below is the Statement of Purpose and membership eligibility criteria from our Bylaws.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The purpose of the "Educational TV Channel" (hereinafter "ETVC") is two-fold: (1) to serve the educational, social and recreational needs of transvestites (either female or male), transsexuals (either female or male), and all other persons (either female or male) whose social role differs in any degree from that role considered to be appropriate for an individual of his or her genetic sex, and (2) to undertake educational activities intended to assist the general public in comprehending transvestism, transsexualism, and transgenderism.

MEMBERSHIP (Eligibility)

Membership in ETVC is open to any person (male or female) who is 18 years of age or older and who believes that he or she is, or may be, a (1) transvestite, (2) transsexual, or (3) person whose social role differs in any degree from that role considered to be appropriate for an individual of his or her genetic sex. Membership is also open to (1) a spouse or significant other of one who is eligible for membership in ETVC under the preceding sentence, and (2) one who is 18 years of age or older and who has (a) a personal or professional interest in one or more persons who fall into one or more of the categories established in the preceding sentence, or (b) a personal or professional interest in transgenderism or gender dysphoria generally. (BYLAWS adopted May 31, 1984)



DIRECTIONS

From the East Bay:

Take I-80 or I-580 to across the Bay Bridge to the Fifth St. exit, turn left onto Fifth St. and left again onto Bryant St.

From north of San Francisco:

Follow US 101 across the Golden Gate Bridge and thru the city to I-80. Take the Fourth St. exit directly onto Bryant St. The Chez is straight ahead.

From the South Bay:

Take US 101 north to I-80 and the Fourth St. exit (as above). Alternatively, take 1-280 to its end at Fourth St., cross over Fourth, go one block and take a left onto Third St. and go up 4 blocks to Bryant St.

Those of us with a lot of facial hair are stuck with a serious problem if we are to ap! pear attractive as a woman. A super-close shi the skin line instead of pulling free. The do wonders... for a few hours. Even then, a "made uo" look may not be what you really want. Electrolysis? Perhaps if you have \$3. 000 and 150 hours of time to spare.

waxing seems to work by diverting the energy other night on any dark hairs which persist, a hair needs for growth and using it instead to repair root damage. Repeated waxing reduces very light colored. Thirty minutes waxing on the number, size, and darkness of hairs. Many a weekend is all that is needed to keep my hairs seem to give up entirely. I'M not convint face clean, clear, and soft. (The initial wax ced that hormone use is necessary for good re ing took me about 8 hours in four lights and sults (though i am on a moderate dose myself) 2 ; it was not fun.) What does pay off is patience, daily attenti on (at first) and some initial inconvenience.

able in most drug stores. This wax is a mix thre of pine tar and beeswax. The instruction included are enough to start with, but waxing the face is no easy task. It seems to take a bout 3/16ths inch of growth for the wax to get a good grip the first application. Some of . your friends may wonder if you are growing a beard-just the opposite;

I heated the wax in an old ceramic coffee mug sitting in a pot of gently boiling water and applied the wax with a tongue depressor or small spoon. The wax must be as hot as pos sible without being painful. Try a spot on your legs first to get familiar with the pro cedure. (Better still, do your entire body;) then apply a thick strip about 1/2 in. wide and 3 in. long vertically on one cheek. Leave

a thick knob of wax near the chin (this is your grip to pull with). When the wax has coold enough to be solid but still flexible. pull the strip off with a firm, quick, and smooth motion parallel to the plane of the face. directtion of hair growth is important always pull in the opposite direction.

There is some pain involved-about like be ing slapped in the face. You may find that the areas above the lip and on the neck are just too sensitive to do this way at first. Later waxings become almost painless and lar ge areas can be done in one application.

It may take several evenings to completely clear your face the first time. Use tweezers my first week, Ihad to get out the tweezers every night to get the hairs which brok at ave followed by skillful foundation work can still-enarged follicle openings tended to get clogged with dirt or tiny specks of clotted Blood, so I scrubbed my face nightly with rubbing alcohol. > Some cautions here-waxing changes the hair roots such that electrolysis is not effec tive for up to several months after the last waxing. Don"t use wax if your skin is very thin or sensitive. Never wax the same area twice in a day- if you do, you may find your self peeling later as if you'd been sunburn ed. After waxing, clean your face with baby cil followed by alcohol. It's a good idea to wax in the evening and then sleep with a light layer of an antibacterial ointment such as Neosporin or Bacitracin to reduce the possibility of infection. Hever use cre me bleach or other harsh chemicals on your face after waxing. BE careful where you do this-hot wax ruins clothing and rugs. Allow for at least a month a month of waxing and tweezing before expecting acceptable results and don't give up; Toss out that heavy foun dation, ladies;
