**RGA MEETINGS:** 

The Rainbow Gender Association meets on the 1st and 3d Fridays of each month from 8-11 p.m. at the New Community of Faith Church,

## RGA PURPOSES:

1. To provide a safe and welcome place for male-to-female and female-to-male transsexuals, transvestites, and their significant others to get together with like-minded individuals. Attendance at RGA functions is open to all interested persons regardless of gender.

2. To promote the growth and development of RGA members as complete women and men through emotional support and education.

3. To reach out to all transsexuals and transvestites in an effort to help them to accept and make peace with themselves.

Following are some suggested topics:

- RGA Activities (Past meetings as well as upcoming meetings);
- activities and events of the crossdressing community in general;
- articles of interest from the publications of other groups (credited, of course);
- articles of self-help about feminine comportment, makeup, fashion styles, color coordination, etc;
- correspondence, feedback from the readers and open letters;
- general interest items like birthdays, photos, and personal experiences.

Changes: Format - How much the format or appearance of the Rainbow will change depends on the facilities available to produce it.

Schedule - both the RGA and ETVC newsletters are published bimonthly on the same date. Starting with the October-November issue the RGA Rainbow will still be bimonthly but offset by one month from that of the ETVC Newsletter. This should make the two newsletters more complementary rather than competitive or duplicative. Subscription period - Again starting with the October-November issue of the Rainbow, all subscriptions will be on an annual period from October through September. Therefore new subscribers as well as previous subscribers are urged to use the attached subscription blank to receive six bimonthly issues of the Rainbow for the next 12 months. Any part left over from a previous subscription will be credited to the new subscription or returned.

Cost - With regret the cost of a subscription to Rainbow will have to be increased from \$4.00 to \$5.00. In the past, materials as well as time have been donated. A newsletter should at least be able to support itself as far as materials and postage are concerned. With regard to time, it's a labor of love.

RGA is probably the most unstructured gender organization in existence. That bothers some and they feel it needs to be corrrected. To many of us that is what makes it a success and why it runs so well. Our meetings are open to all those who are interested. Although we do not maintain a membership roll, you can consider yourself a member if you attend meetings or subscribe to the Rainbow. We invite you to do both.
