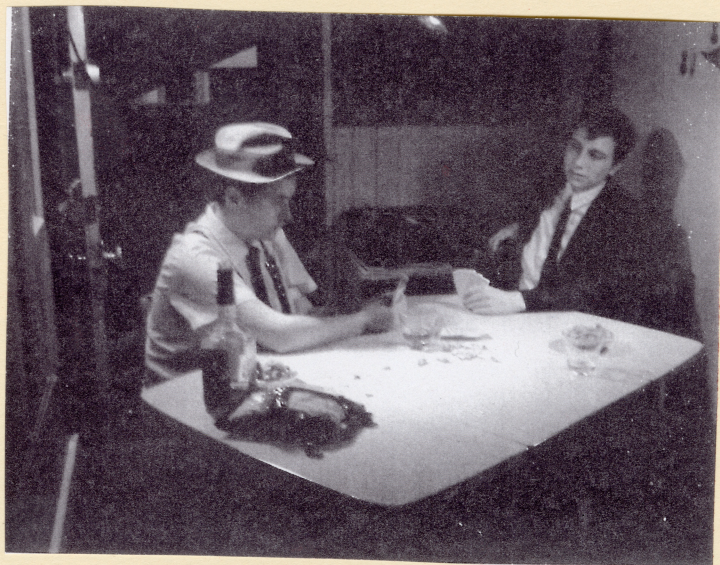

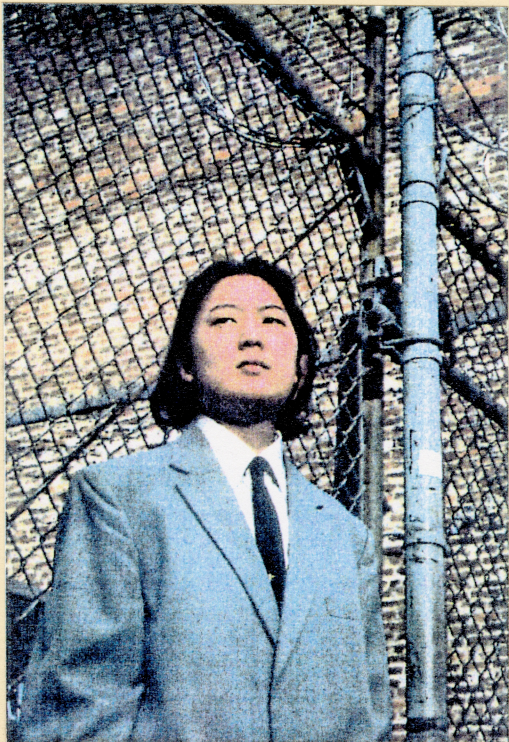

The *Fable of the Rape of Kristin* is from the Kirche von Suurhusen Altarpiece. This is the centerpiece of a polytych depicting the seduction of a young peasant by a young god. The taut arms symbolize power. The intensity in the face and eyes reveal a fiery passion. This piece exudes the Renaissance belief that the soul could ascend to a higher plane through the contemplation of beauty, revealing the two supreme principles of the divine, love and light.

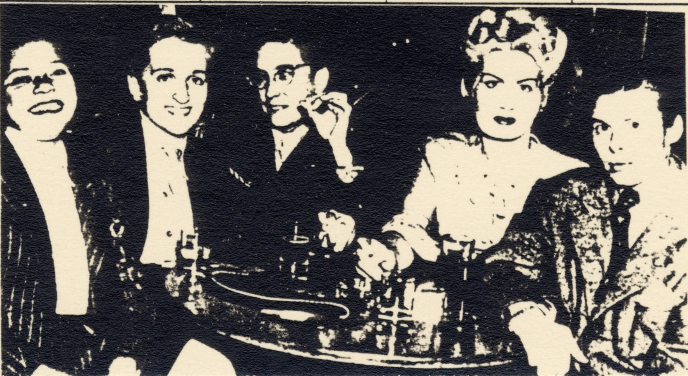

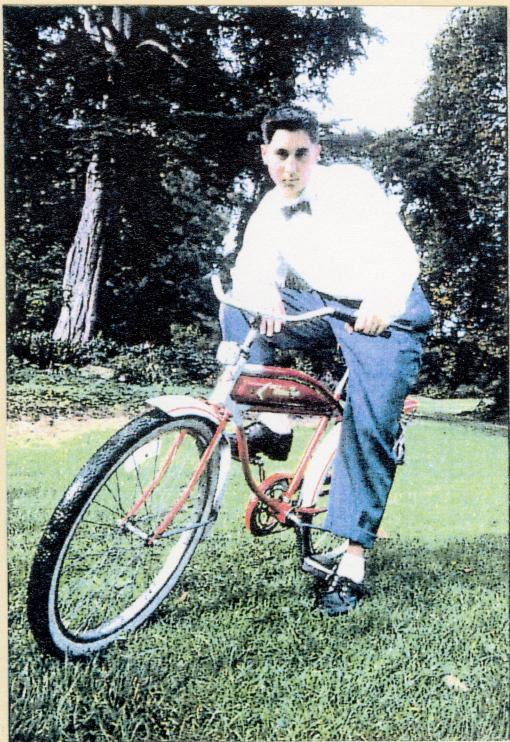

The lesbian organisation Daughters of Bilitis started forty years ago on October 1st 1955.

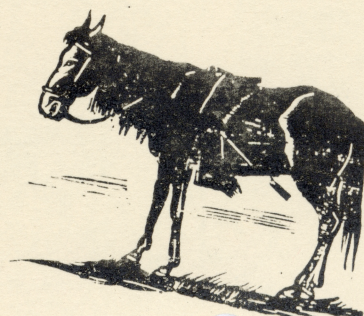
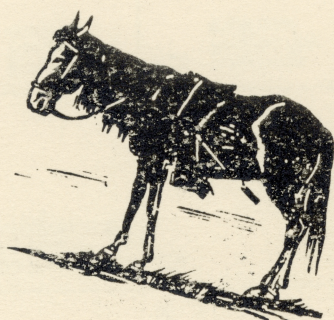
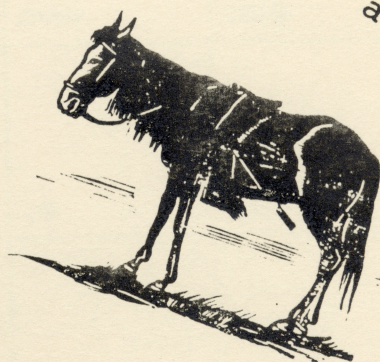
