Chapter Promotion & Activities

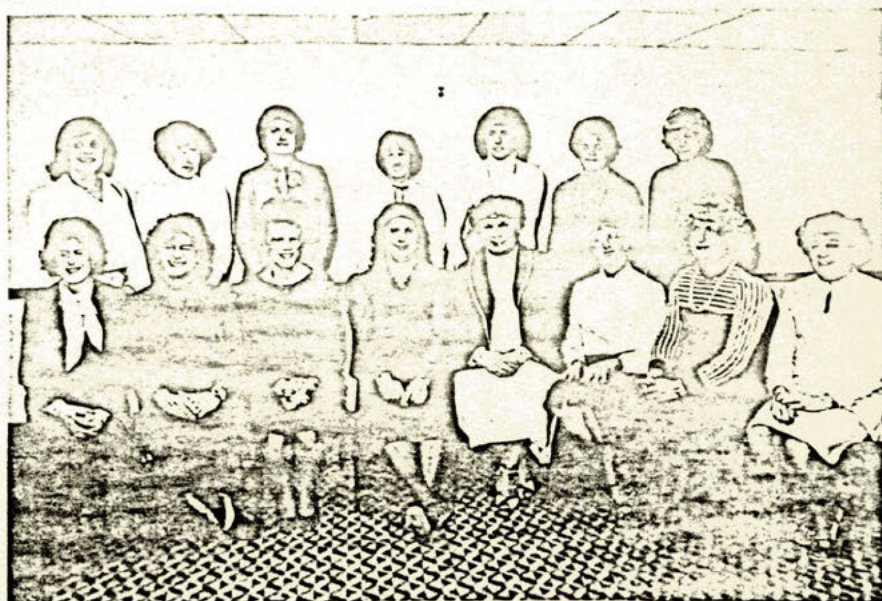
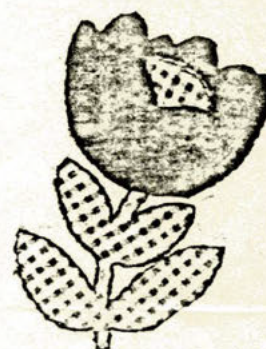

Several actions are taking place which will impact our Chapter.

1. We are designating geographical areas for which a Chapter Sister will coordinate our activities: contact new members, take counts for meetings, etc. Two will be in New Jersey, and the others for New York, Connecticut, and other areas. There will be a total of seven, with seven Sisters who can now truly call themselves GALS (Geographic Area LeaderS). These will not be mini-Chapters in our group, but necessary support people for our growing Chapter.

2. It was agreed at our March meeting that the Chapter must have a set of by-laws, including provision for the election of Chapter Officers. Jana (NJ-304-T), drafted a set of by laws for the TRI-ESS group in Iowa, and we will use these as a basis for our Chapter. A By-Laws Committee has been established consisting of Jana, Wilma, and myself. We hope to have a proposed set of by laws for you by May, with potential Chapter elections in June.

3. In order to allow me more time for the newsletter and other items, I've asked Lynda to assume the duties of Chapter Treasurer effective April 15th. Lynda has accepted this position, and received a round of applause at our March meeting.

There is a song written by John Denver that became quite popular a few months ago. The title of the song is "Perhaps Love", and it is one of my favorites. One of its lead lines goes like this: "Perhaps love is like a window, perhaps an open door, it invites us to come closer, it wants to show us more".
