Let's get real crazy. How about a parade? Anyhow, it will be a blast so come to the party and win a prize.

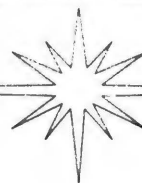
NOVEMBER 19, 1992 FEATURING ALISON LAING

Before applying your foundation put any type of moisturizing cream or lotion on your face. MURIEL SUGGESTS...

STEAMING: is a very simple procedure which is done by allowing hot steam to bathe the face from a running tap or pan of hot water. When the face is heavily perspiring, the pores are open as widely as they can be, allowing all the impurities to be unlocked from deep within the pores. A wonderful way to enhance the activity of the steaming/sauna is to use Gaylord Hauser's "Swiss Kriss" following the simple directions. This is an herbal mixture which is very stimulating and therapeutic.

EXFOLIATING: is generally done with a gritty or grainy product. Never muse around the eyes. Be absolutely certain to work it around very gently and pay particular attention to the creases around the nose and the general T-zone (across the forehead and down the center of the face and around the chin).

RE-SURFACE: Both of this and the above heading are interchangeable. Because the sophistication of today's treatment preparations is such most of the available products - a huge array - tend to overlap in these two functions. To make your new skin treatment program easier, just think of resurfacing and exfoliating as one step utilizing two separate products.

Masks will "re-Surface" the skin (as the sloughing products do, also) better than any other preparation. They are available in various forms - peel-off types, clay, lotions, foams, etc. As a general rule-of-thumb peeling types are the most effective in removing completely dead cells, while they clay types are more efficient in absorbing the deep-down grime and impurities.

Lotions, creams and foam are more stimulating to the circulation. All are intended to make the walls of the pores more firm, therefore causing a tighter appearance to the skin and giving a smoother, firmer and softer surface and brighter, clearer translucence to the natural glow of the complexion.

That's it for now. Next issue let's talk about make-up.

Have you been thinking about hormones? Do you know what happens when you take any type of hormones? Is it dangerous or safe?

A definitive, reliable review of *Hormones: the goo, the bad, and warnings* is a book on the subject available for \$9.95 from IFGE, P.O. Box 367, Wayland, MA 01788.

Hormones, by Sheila Kirk, MD should read by all members. Finally, there is a factual and accurate source for the facts (not fiction) about hormone therapy and its effect on both males and females pursuing a gender transition.

In *Hormones* Dr. Sheila Kirk has compiled data from a vast number of clinical studies and individual evaluations relating to a wide variety of hormone therapies. She has used her expertise and years of experience in the gender community to write a clear, concise and accurate guide to the use of hormones.

This is mandatory reading for anyone contemplating or currently involved in hormone therapy of any kind, and for medical and mental health professionals. This book can help transgendered people work cooperatively with their physicians to achieve the best and safest results possible.

The proper use of hormones can make a gender transition more rewarding and enjoyable. But it must be done the right way. And reading *Hormones* is the best way to begin.
