'Change of sex'--Annulment sought

WASHINGTON - Pat Johnston has asked a court in suburban Arlington, Va., to annul his second marriage on the grounds that he was a woman at the time of the wedding and unable to consummate the union with another woman, the Washington Star-News said yesterday.

The paper quoted Johnston as saying that although inability to consummate the marriage was proper legal grounds for the annulment, he had had sexual intercourse with women regularly since a sex change operation last February.

As a woman, Johnston said, he married a sailor in 1957 and bore two daughters betore obtaining a divorce in 1963. But even before the operation he married his wife. Mary Lee in December 1971.

A masculine-looking figure with long, thick sideburns and the beginning of a beard. Johnston, 32, told the newspaper he

has lived with four different women - including his wife - and dated dozens of others

He said he had always believed he was a hermaphrodite - a person with both male and female sex organs. During the operation in which Johnston's female organs were removed, Dr. Sava Nedelcovych discovered partly developed male organs in his abdomen near the appendix, he added.

Through shots of the male hormone testosterone, which he received for five years, Johnston grew two inches to 5-foot-4, his weight jumped from 110 to 135 pounds, his shoe size went from 6B to 8D, and his chest, which measured 34 inches as a woman, expanded to 36 inches, normal for a man his size, after surgical removal of the breasts.

The newspaper quoted the doctor as saying that the male hormone had develped the male sex organ to a point where Johnson could perform sexually similar to a man, although he could produce no sperm.

NEW YORK-Hypnosis has proven effec- | tive in stimulating breast growth, an experiment reported in The Journal of Sex Research shows.

If future studies confirm these findings, hypnosis may provide women who

desire larger breasts with a satisfactory alternative to surgery. The experiment, conducted at an un-disclosed university, involved 19 volun-teer female university students ranging from 18 to 40. Its purpose was to deter-mine whether such hypnotic techniques as age regression, time projection and suggestion could produce psychological and physiological responses capable of stimulating an increase in the size of the subjects' breasts.

After breast measurements were taken, each of the women in the study underwent 12 one-hour hypnosis sessions. During each session, the subjects were hypnotically regressed to the age at which their breasts were developing and were given suggestions to make them believe that they could feel their breasts growing.

The women were also projected ahead in time and told to visualize themselves as ossessing larger breasts in the future. At the conclusion of the study, breast measurements for the women in the

Promoter jailed

> LOS ANGELES (UPI) Jerry Dean Michael, who gained a degree of fame posing as the woman promoter of a controversial three-wheel car. was convicted Wednesday of jumping bail 14 years ago when he fled California following his arrest on counterfeit charges.

> A federal jury of seven women and five men deliberated less than 30 minutes and then returned a unanimous guilty verdict against Michael, who used the name G. Elizabeth Carmichael while promoting the Dale automobile.

U. S. District Court Judge Malcolm M. Lucas set June 16 for sentencing Michael, who

could receive a maximum penalty of five years imprison-ment and a \$5,000 fine.

Michael, 47. a self-termed transsexual, wore women's clothing during his trial which began Tuesday. While await-ing trial, he wore men's clothing but was in a segregated section of the men's jail.

Michael was arrested in Miami, Fla., last month, two months after Dallas authorities charged him with grand theft in connection with the sale of securities in a company he set up to promote his so-called "wonder" car. He earlier had moved his company from Encino, Calif., under pressure from the California Corporations Department.
