IS MY FIANCEE GAY?

I'm engaged to be married in November. My happiness should be complete. That is far from being true. My family insists that the man I love is gay.

Most of my family has accepted my sex-change; the others tolerate it for my mom's sake.

I made the mistake of telling my sister that I met my fiancee through a personal ad that he put in a small local paper - "Handsome Male seeks post-op transsexual for possible long-term relationship . ." She told her rednecked husband. He has convinced my father and my two brothers that if a man advertised for a transsexual woman, he's gay; no question about it.

I love my family, I also love my fiancee; I don't want to have to make a choice between them. If my family forces me to do so, I will choose my fiancee. My sister regrets telling her husband and tells me that if I go ahead and marry, my family will come around and that I shouldn't worry about it.

Every time my family and I try to discuss my impending marriage, it ends up in an argument. I haven't spoken to any member of my family in the last over two months. I told them I didn't care what he was I was going to marry him. My father told me if I did that he was through with me.

It never occurred to me when I read the ad that the person placing the ad might be gay. All the arguing with my family caused me to start wondering if he might be gay and how do I really feel about it. The answer came easy; I am a woman via sex-change surgery - he is a male. Our relationship cannot be a gay relationship.

I doubt I will get many proposals of marriage if the man knows I had sex-change surgery. I don't want to grow old alone and I am not about to give up a chance at happiness because of other people's ignorance.

I asked my roommate if she had the opportunity to be with a woman who loved her and worshipped the ground she walked on opposed to being alone for the rest of her life with no one, which would she She said she would spend the rest of her life choose? alone.

My friends keep telling me that in the closed-minded state I live in I'll never find what I want here. They tell me don't give up on something you really want. Believe me I don't want to. I know there are lesbian identified transsexuals out there, I'm just having a problem finding them. I'd like to see some articles, pictorials and personal ads on lesbian identified transsexuals. I would like to hear their views on things, experiences, life-styles and suggestions on how I might be able to meet someone like themselves.
