

JUNE WEDDING June 30, 1988





Wear something you'd like to be photographed in and bring your own camera and film, so that you can take and have your own photos.



<Reaching Out>

Hi again. Hope you all had a good couple of months since the last newsletter. I would like to thank Kaylan for donating tapes to the library. We really appreciate the generosity and we now have two good tapes on make-up application. One is Donna Mills "The Eyes Have It". I think she's one of the best looking women on nighttime TV. She applies make-up to herself for daytime and nighttime looks, etc. The tape runs about 1 hour. The other tape is "Basic Daily Make-Up -- For All Ages" by Ms. Westmore of the famous family of Hollywood make-up artists. It shows make-up for teenagers through older adults. It has some good tips and lasts about 30 minutes.

Another new tape is the Janus Society Panel Discussion at the Chez. The Janus Society is a group involved with all aspects of S&M. The tape is a very open and honest discussion of SM, BD, Humiliation, Slaves and Dominance. A few of their members are crossdressers. Of the six panel members, one was a male to female crossdresser and one a female to male crossdresser. The tape is a little on the dark side, and it runs about 2 hours long. It's a good introduction to the subject by people who live it. A Big Thanks to Jennifer for taping it and donating the tape to the library.

Also, we have a special tape called "Secrets of Imitation, Female Impersonators and Professional Crossdressing" by Ms. April [REDACTED]. It includes such topics as:

Do it yourself temporary cosmetic surgery using common household items, such as instant glue and mini staplers.

How to have a more feminine voice with a specially modified gaff.

Using jello pudding and large balloons to create versatile realistic breast forms that serve as an emergency late night snack that serves 4.

Inexpensive beard removal using industrial strength duct tape.

Rapid temporary scalp hair growth with radioactive estrogen 235 applied topically (may have some side effects).

Last, but not least, make-up magic with magic markers.

Coming on April 1st, 1989, "How to get a complete deluxe sex change for less than \$79.95 with the help of your friends and a few kitchen tools". I suggest ordering early for this one!

Now, there has been some continuing confusion on how to order tapes. I hope I can clear this up. All tapes are listed in one newsletter or another with approximate times. You can choose up to two hours for one tape. So, if you pick a 10-minute tape and a 1-1/2 hour tape, you still have 20 minutes left to make up your complete 2-hour tape. Or, you can pick 1 tape that runs 2 hours or 2 tapes that run 1 hour each. I may fill in a tape to make it a full two hours if your choices don't complete it. In any case it's \$10.00 per 2-hour tape, full or not.

We now have 10 tapes with programs of 5 minutes to 2 hours on female impersonation, 15 tapes of 10 minutes to 2 hours on TV's and TS's, 6 tapes on ETVC events, and 2 instructional tapes on make-up. (Thanks again, Kaylan.)

Also, even if you don't have any tapes to donate, but know of some we should have in our library, let us know. Or, if you would like to see a tape on wig care or voice, or any other subject, please let us know. If there is enough interest, maybe ETVC can produce one on that subject. There's been a continuing interest in the video library, so I guess we are filling a need. The library now has a total of 34 programs on tape, and there are a few more soon to be added. When you go out shopping, don't forget to carry some Green Cards (Introducing ETVC) and TV and TS pamphlets. While you're talking to the clerks you can give them this information and ask if they would offer discounts to our members. Don't forget to give us the information about your favorite shops, so that we can add them to our Tip Sheets.

Une Americane a Paris by Renee

It wasn't easy, but it was wonderful: 10 days living as the woman I really am in the world capital of style and chic. The lingerie is well-made, with lots of lace and in the most delicious hues and textures. Clothes too are nearly all made in France with quality and design vastly superior to our Pacific Rim clothiers. Jewelry and accessories likewise stand out for their tastefulness and durability. Most department stores run tremendous clearance sales in January and August, and salesgirls were uniformly eager to help and are tolerant of a foreigner's awkwardness. The dollar is weak now, so if possible wait until the Franc reaches 7 or 8 to the dollar.

To ride the Metro cheap, get an automat picture in any large station and ask for an Orange Card, a weekly pass. Avoid the police, because if your passport picture doesn't match your looks, they can and will haul you down to the precinct station for up to 48 hours on the assumption of fraudulent papers, a very big deal in France. Expect to be taken for gay by those who read you.

Passing is a real challenge in the world capital of "Vive la Difference". The cues for a woman are complex and require close observation and practice. No woman goes out without looking absolutely perfect, regardless of the image she seeks to present. They dress with extraordinary flair, color sense, and are fashion conscious and quite conservative for the most part. It is extremely gutsy to crossdress, and so it doesn't usually even occur to people that you'd dare do it. They will stare in disbelief if they read you, but then go back to their business. The best camouflage is a male escort. The shorter you are, the easier to pass. At night, a single woman garners more than a little verbal male attention.

There is no active TV-TS group in Paris as there is in London, though there is a gay scene where crossdressing is sometimes appropriate. AIDS is just starting to engulf the gay community, so be careful. Our image of the French as outrageous and risqué is wrong; they are strict traditionalists, and rarely go beyond intellectual adventurousness. Their world-renowned reputation for arrogance and impatience with English speakers is by-and-large accurate: they just can't stand ANYONE breaking their wonderful but very rigid rules of taste and manners: crossdressing breaks every one of their rules! Passing in Sacramento or San Jose is no guarantee of passing in Paris, but so what? Let them stare.

Bathrooms in cafes are often non-gender, but the sink and mirror are out in the hall. It is a lonely city even for the Parisians themselves, so take a friend if possible. As anywhere, crossdressing in Paris is a test of your level of self-acceptance, but well-worth the effort! In an emergency call Rev. Douce, 46-27-49-36. "It is clearly sexist and genderist to assume that female crossdressing as male is condoned, as it is socially (think of the woman police officer's uniform -Ed.), while men crossdressing as women may be suspect in a number of ways."

TRANSGENDER LEGAL FUND



IFGE Convention April 4-9, 1989


