WHY RUN?

There comes a time in the pursuit and evolution of who we are to tilt windmills! To tilt windmills out of anger, or self-seeking or pride, or to make a better place for all. Or because someone should do it.

The Chi Chapter election for Membership and Outreach Vice Presidency has two aspirants, so far: Candace and Claudia.

Chi Chapter's realm is basically Chicago and its suburbs. However, it borders are limitless. People call us from as far away as Newfoundland, Canada, Palm Beach, Florida and Los Angeles.

These callers are primarily crossdressers. Curious, frightened and lonely men wanting affirmation of their wholeness. Our primary purpose and life blood is the newcomer.

The World Wide Web broadens our outreach and exposure to the world. People communicate with typed words and never feel the warmth of a person's voice. It is very impersonal.

Although hundreds of letters are mailed each year, this form of communication is also impersonal. It, too, lacks the "human touch, a voice, to communicate our "feminine side.

Some nights, on the "hot line", hours are spent listening, affirming and encouraging our telephone callers. Assuring them our ..gift" is wholesome. Often, there are lapses of months between calls of some individuals. And they feel secure in talking to the same person.

There is nothing like the "personal touch of "Candace". She makes "house calls"! Not even Doctors do that anymore. Two house calls have been made "En Femme" to single crossdressers in their homes: Bartlett and Aurora. Two prospects were met at a hospital parking lot (Hoffman Estates and Central DuPage Hospitals), as they needed a "human form" for confidence and were escorted to their first meeting.

One prospect was met at a bank parking lot in downtown Lombard and driven to Transformations for a "do". Another was met in a electrolysis salon, in Rockford and shared lunch in a public park. Another was met at Transformations and later after her "do" taken to a Chinese Restaurant in Elmhurst and for refreshment at Temptations. And lastly, Candace has

Vice President for Programming... Why would anyone accept a nomination for a position like that, when she could much more easily just sit back and enjoy being herself? The simplest answer is that I actually think it would be a lot of fun. The real answer is that I want to give something back to Chi Chapter for all the warmth and support you've given me over the past year or so since I've joined.

That being said, what do I have in mind as far as programming is concerned? Three things... First, a continuation of the wonderful type of programs which Rori brought to us over the past few years, with a well-balanced mix of serious and fun stuff. Second, a first-Saturday-of-the-month social event designed with new members in mind. Third, at least one event per year co-sponsored by Tri-Ess and CGS.

As to the regular meeting programs, we have a tradition of having fun which we need to uphold. Putting on the Ritz, the Halloween costume party, the Spring Fling... these events make Chi Chapter what it is, and of course will continue. Other programs could include interactive classes in the feminine arts, opportunities to show off your talents (music, poetry, etc.), a vendors' fair, a fashion extravaganza, and so forth. But we also have a tradition of dealing with difficult issues. We could invite experts in human sexuality or psychology who have dealt with our community. We could bring in people from the Human Rights Commission or Horizons to discuss their anti-discrimination programs. We could have a panel of the senior Chi Chapter members, discussing their experiences over the years. We need to have these types of programs as well because, after all, we are a support group.

The first Saturday event is something I've been thinking of for a while. The newcomers' group fulfills some of the functions of the Big Sister program, but not all of them. What is missing is someone to hold little sister's hand as she ventures out into the big world for the first time. This can be pretty scary. The first Saturday event would be an opportunity for some of us more experienced girls to help our newcomers feel more comfortable with themselves in ordinary situations. Nothing fancy... dinner out, a movie or show, a trip to a museum, a day at the mall. We could plan a simple event like this each month which would be safe and a lot of fun.

Finally, I would like to see Chi Chapter actually cosponsor

transported prospective members with "restricted drivers licences.

The "hot line" requires a personal touch. Someone with patience, empathy and the ability to listen and accept all who call. Candace's daughter told her mother, when she found out her father was a crossdresser, "Now I know why Dad was both mother and father to me." Candace instills confidence in others to come and join others at Chi Chapter.

And then there are the calls from the wives, women and girl friends of crossdressers. Most are curious needing understanding and sources of reference. Most want to talk to someone willing to be gentle and sympathetic to their issues as well; so some common ground can be established.

Some are angry and hurt. Their husbands have not told them about themselves from the start and they wonder what else has been "hidden" from them. others feel "violated" when they discover their clothes have been worn by us (without their consent). And others are confused and are in need of the same education and understanding you require. Crossdressers are more whole with the support of a loving (accepting) partner.

The office of Membership and outreach is very important to the "closeted" and their significant others. This officer must give, not only time, but more importantly give of themselves in a ..sisterly", nurturing, sympathetic, empathetic and re-assuring manner.

The proof is in the pudding. There has been a dramatic increase in first timers in the past two years of Candace's reign. Deanna said in early summer of Candace's first term; "Chi Chapter had never had 30 newcomers at a meeting." There have been several meetings with thirty newcomers in attendance.

However when the newcomer arrives at our meeting, then it is up to You, the membership. What have you done? Have you circulated and chatted with the newcomers, clearly identified with a name tag with pink flamingos? Sharing your feelings and experiences with them? Supporting their decision and extending an embrace of friendship?

IF NOT! WHY NOT?

Chi Chapter expects, those who aspire to hold the office of Vice President of Membership and Outreach to promote Tri Ess and especially Chi Chapter, to ALL you come in contact. For we can not have two masters.

Other groups, such as CGS and the Gemini Gender Group have realized the time and patience needed to bring the closeted crossdressers into their groups as a sustaining members, as we have in Chi Chapter. It is unusual to have a first timer join

immediately; or if they join, feel good enough about their decision to attend regularly. Dedication to Chi Chapter is paramount to our success.

If there is anyone in Chi Chapterland who can meet the dedication and loyalty requirements presented, come forward. Either as an aspirant of the Membership and Outreach Vice President of Chi Chapter, or actively join us in our endeavor.

We believe the best candidate for this post is CANDACE D. MAHNE. She has a proven record of loyalty to Chi Chapter (Tri Ess), embracing others' participation and empathy on the "hot line". She has expanded outreach from colleges to seminaries and home visits, as well as providing transportation to our meeting.

AMERICA ON LINE

Last month we had four new members that heard of us through the Chi Chapter Tri Ess Page on the World Wide Web that our resident near genius, Denise, posted.

I've seen it once. Its beautiful and absolutely excellently done! I can see how anyone interested in cross dressing who ran across it would want to check us out. Unfortunately, I've only been able to find it once. I'm beginning to think that was an accident because I refuse to use those stupid addresses that have all that gobbledegook in them!

I'm on AOL now and I got into that by accident too. I haven't found the secret to life, my fortune, or true love yet, but its fun and more important than anything else I guess, its "cutting edge", "bloody cutting edge", the Howl of the 90's.

I don't know how many free disks for America On Line I have received through the mail or with a software program over the last year but it must be at least 10. I finally installed one a month or so ago and since that time, have received two more.

A friend of mine has received as many as I have and he gives them to his kids. They install a new one every month to get the 10 hours of free time allowed. Trouble is, they have to give them a credit card number and a real name to open an account. This worked for a while when they used different credit cards but when they had to use a credit card that was used before, even months before, AOL kicked it back and said, "That's a no no! We will give you only 5 hours free time." So it goes, but they took it.

Last year the Tribune was running ads to access their paper and their archives on line. I thought that would be neat. I could use it for a reference if I happened to be writing something or if I just wanted the straight poop. Imagine being able to go back through every issue of the Trib since 1985! WOW,

I called the number and ordered it sent post haste. I think it cost \$49.95. In about 10 days it arrived and I couldn't wait to install it. Upon opening it, I discovered it was no more than your typical AOL install program that I had been throwing away.

And once into AOL, I discovered that The Tribune was one of several news services available including the New York Times and any AOL program would have made them available.

Foiled again by the fickle finger of computer land!

I had told a friend of mine what I was up to and it turns out he wanted some info on an article about an invention he had seen in the Trib last summer. I said, "Come on over. We'll look it up on my new gizmo."

We sat down at my computer, clicked the AOL icon and in

a few minutes we were at the door to the Chicago Tribune Archives. "Wow, this is great!" I said to my friend, "I could spend hours looking up things!". Then I noticed that there was a special fee of \$1.25 per minute to use the archives older than a few days! Per minute mind you. A buck twenty-five! That was during Prime time but the fee dropped way down to only 4 cents a minute after 6 o'clock. But even 4 cents a minute is \$2.40 an hour! And I don't need that.

Foiled again!

We waited until after 6 and searched and searched and couldn't find a thing about the invention. He thinks now it was in the Parade Magazine that comes with the Sunday Trib but unfortunately is not in the archives.

I haven't used the archives since. In December, I had 10 hours of free time and I think at the end of December I had about 435 minutes of free time left.

I found it very annoying having to wait while AOL Art or graphics downloaded to my computer. Whenever you went to a new topic you were interested in, a long thin box would appear on the left side of the screen and slowly fill with a blue color. The computer was loading graphics and the blue line indicated what %age of a graphic was loaded. As soon as it would stop, it would start again! This went on forever it seemed. It never stopped. It was always loading.

Unfortunately, I only had a 2400 baud modem which is really the wrong thing to have on AOL or any Internet service. It was a pain in the butt to say the least.

Having avoided even trying to use AOL the first two weeks of January, curiosity struck me again to find out what this Internet thing was all about. What am I missing? Is there something out there in this mysterious never never land that will make my life much better and me a more interesting and informed person?. Could I find romance and happiness on the Internet? Or better yet, the secret to life or for that matter, my fortune?

I couldn't resist any longer and bought the fastest external modem I could. A 28,800 baud model which, for some unknown reason, downloads at 57,600 baud! Its so fast now the long narrow box appears and turns completely blue almost as soon as it appears when I'm on America On Line, but when I get on the Internet, it slows down pretty bad.

I've been on now at the new speed and have learned you can sign on with up to five different names, all with different profiles.

My first screen name is very close to my real name and the profile is the real me because it has to match the credit card I used. My second screen name is "Sir Bill 440" and the profile matches the real me. I put in "Bill" at first and the computer checked its files and gave me "Bill 11,380" because there were so many other "Bills"! Now who would want a name like "Bill 11,380"? Not me but you see people in the chat rooms with big numbers behind the name.

I found a chat room called the Gazebo which is for the Transgendered Community and found a lot of cross dressers in it. I went in at first with my real name but said I was really Kiki. A little box in the upper right appears when you are in a chat room

that tells the number of people in that room and their names. You can scroll through the names, click one, and that person's profile shows up if they have one. That's fun.

The first time I was there I asked the girls about going out dressed and where did you go. Then I mentioned the Tri Ess meeting I had gone to the Saturday before and that I went dressed. A "Rita" figured I was voyeur and was cruising to get my kicks. Its understandable, they're all over the place. She asked, "William, what kind of hosiery did you wear"? I answered, "Jet black" and that satisfied her.

Now Kiki has her own screen name, "Kikicar" which is quite good considering the number of people who get on this thing and, --I'll never have any trouble passing. I said I was female and believe it or not I feel a little guilty for it.

The first time I was on as my Kikicar self in the Gazebo, I typed a few things and before you knew it some guy by the name of Don sent me an instant private message. This enables you to remain in the chat room, but have a private chat with someone else in the room. Turns out he was coming to Chicago soon and wanted to get together. Hee hee. I was being hit on! My first Internet hit. Said he would buy me a drink too.

He wanted my number and I gave him my Internet Address. Hee hee.

Now if some guy wants my number when I'm out, I can say, "You can reach me on the Internet at "Kikicar @AOL. Com."

Now that's cutting edge.

Cool! Hee hee. Bye.
