Our program for the evening began with an introduction from Eve, who is a client of Cheryl, and someone who has had 25 years of electrolysis on her body. Eve claims that Cheryl has been the most understanding of all the technicians she has had work on her

Cheryl Gibisch then gave a brief discussion of her work and the two types of electrolysis that are recognized by the Federal Trade Commission as authentic: they are, Galvanic Current and Short Wave Radio. Cheryl claims that any other type of work is not true electrolysis. In describing the

differences between the two processes, Cheryl explained that with Galvanic Current, the technician must place the needle in your folicle for a period of 10-15 seconds, while with Short Wave, it is only for a period of 1/20th to 1/10th second. This is the method Cheryl uses at her shop. Another difference is that with Short Wave, more sessions will be needed for each folicle, however, the pain level is much less than Galvanic Current. Cheryl's main message was to shop around for a good technician. Like anyone in the service business, some are better than others - so be patient, and don't stick with someone you are not happy with. Cheryl then answered many questions from our group. A final point, costs do not necessarily determine a technician's competence.

March Meeting...

The next meeting of Chi Chapter will be held on the third Saturday of the Month, March 18th, at the Midway Motor Lodge in Elk Grove. Rooms will open at 5:00 PM to allow those in need a place and time to change. So, after visiting every tall girl, catalog outlet, or designer boutique in Chicago, Milwaukee, Indianapolis, Grand Rapids, etc., you FINALLY found the perfect outfit to wear to the next Tri-Esss party! You found the perfect shoes, purse, and jewelery, but when you try everything on, something is still missing! Your Glasses!

When you look in the mirror, those brown or black or wire-rimmed glasses just don't add anything! You could try contact lenses, or just go to your friendly optometrist and say "Show me something in a Diane yon Furstenburg!" But there is another alternative: Glasses by mail!

The company I have dealt with is called: Prism Optical, Inc of North Miami, Florida. Their catalog states "prescription eyeglasses by mail since 1959." When you receive the catalog, you will find sections for both men and women's glasses. The women's section consists of four and a half pages of eyeglass frames in many feminine styles. The price range is quite wide, with frames selling from \$18 to over \$100. Descriptions are complete, listing frame color, and size of applicable lenses.

In the back of the catalog, you will find complete information on how to order your lenses and correct frame size. The frame guide is easy to use, and lets you measure your temple and bridge size right off your current glasses. There are many lens options listed, including tinting, coatings, etc. A small extra charge is made for heavy prescription or special grinding, When I added it all up, the total price of Lisa's glasses came to \$60, including a \$22

For regular prescriptions, they promise shipping in four working days from receipt of your order, however, I found this to be a tad optimistic, as it was about twelve days until I received my order. (This is still fast!) My glasses fit perfectly! Size and style were exactly what I wanted!

Special services you might be interested in: You may order a pair of frames sans lenses, just to see how they look on you. If you don't like them, they will refund your money. An express shipping option is available for an extra \$25, which gets your glasses made and shipped to you in one day.
