"I'm a twenty year old woman. For the past year I've been involved in the most exciting relationship I can imagine -- my boyfriend is a transvestite. Women who have never had any experience with transvestites shouldn't knock it until they try it. It can be wonderful.

Transvestism is a relaxation technique for my boyfriend and an extremely arousing erotic practice for both of us. His moods change constantly; he isn't always dressed and we do many things together in a totally straight way. Most of the time, however, he's in the female world one way or another. A little thing like having his nails painted can be all he needs to relax.

The net profit/(loss) for our motel meetings thus far has been as follows:

Profit/(loss) is measured on a per attendee basis: it excludes in the count wives, girlfriends, and guests, and includes meeting fees and the contributions made by several sisters.

Our April meeting, held in Westchester with a conference room and regular room, obviously brought our four-month average down. Now, as that we usually have wives/girlfriends/guests, the \$10.00 meeting fee per member does seem appropriate. We usually do not have a lot of refreshments left-over, so our fiscal position seems good.

We will begin dues renewal time in the month of October. I do not see the need to change the dues structure from \$10.00/year/member. Our "average" cash balance is a little more than \$100.00; of course a publicity move addressing replies from a Dr. Judith K. program, another "Dear Meg" situation, could place us in a fiscal pinch, but I think that we can handle it.

I'd certainly appreciate it if one of our regular Chapter sisters would volunteer her time to become Chapter Treasurer; it would be a help to me.

Wigs warrant special care during summer

The causes of hair loss among women can be bafflingly numerous. Age, medication, allergies, excessive styling, permanents, dyes, poor nutrition and even stress are the stronges factors.

And while cures are not always available of



effective, an alternative is the use of wigs and hair pieces.

Ruth Weintraub, custom wig maker, said that summer can be merciless on

the wearers of wigs and hair pieces. Her advice for comfortable survival during the hot muggy months begins with the choice of wig of hair piece that is closely trimmed, light in hair quantity and airy in construction.

Next is the special maintenance required during the summer. The exposure of human hair to strong sunlight, she said, will eventually cause it to fade slightly in color. The dark shades will turn reddish in color while the grays and lighter shades will become yellowish.

During the summer you can help delay the inevitable, she said, by brushing and cleaning your hair pieces frequently — and also by not exposing them to direct sunlight, swimming and hair spray build-up. Washable synthetic fiber hair pieces tend to resist fading longer and are for this reason better for continuous wear outdoors.

Human hair without moisture or lubricatio obviously becomes dry. And dry hair always looks dull. Synthetic fiber hair pieces that have lost their surface coating will also look dull.

For best results, Ms. Weintraub advised cleaning hair pieces and wigs properly, acc ording to instruction, and frequently. Use hair sprays sparingly and brush daily. And before combing, spray hair piece lightly with plain water to activate its lubricants.
