NEW PUBLICATION FOR TV READERS

Robyn Ann Dormer, a member of Phi Chapter, is publisher and art director of a new publication, *En Femme* magazine, which the cover says is "devoted to the world of transvestism." The six-times-a-year magazine's first issue, covering July/August, contains in its 44 pages two TV fiction stories, articles on electrolysis and "how to make love to a TV", poetry, two comic strips (clever parodies of Dagwood and Cathy), several not-so-clear photos, a profile of the new Renaissance group, classified and display ads, and a letter from the editor.

In addition to Robyn, Rebecca Buchanon (Bridgewater) is listed as managing editor, and Donna Miller is listed as advertising director.

A questionnaire serves as the centerfold. It is designed to determine what types of articles readers want to see.

The matrix says editorial contributions are welcome. No pornographic material will be accepted. Payment for contributions will be "dealt with on an individual basis."

BETTER MAKEUP APPLICATION

Use baby oil as a face preparation instead of soap before shaving. Leave the baby oil on your face, apply shaving cream. Now shave. Said to leave a smooth face, making rinsing easier and offering far less skin irritation.

TIPS ON NAIL CARE

From the ETVC Newsletter comes this tip from Kaye Fisher on using presson nails. She says it stops the usual end-of-the-day or evening wobble.

Kaye says that contact cement works well. She recommends a contact cement made by Ross Chemical of Detriot and sold in the hardware glue sections of such stores as K-Mart. At \$1.50 a tube, it's enough for 25 or more applications.

Apply a coating of glue to the plastic nails and let it dry. Then apply a coating to your own nails. Press the plastic nail to your nail carefully, holding it for about ten seconds. Keep dry for at least an hour and a half.

When the nails are to be removed, apply even outward pressure on the tip and edges to separate press-on nail from your nail. Use a pin to remove glue from the plastic nail.

TURNABOUT: A NEW COMPUTER BULLETIN BOARD

If you have a computer and a modem to communicate over the phone lines, you can access a new computer bulletin board called Turnabout. System operator Misty says there will be boards for TVs and TSs, as well as for other minorities.

Turnabout is up between 8 p.m. and 9 a.m. seven days a week. The telephone number is 512 525 0663. The system is on 300 baud, with 1200 coming soon. New members do not need a password--yet.
