Greetings and salutations! For those of you who sent Christmas cards, thanks very much. I hope you had a joyful Yuletide, and I wish you, as always, a peaceful and a prosperous New Year.

I had probably the best Holiday Season ever, as I spent it with my sister and my fiancee, **Section**, whom I met last March in Ottawa. We got engaged last September and have been living together almost five months now. We are desperately in love, extremely compatible, and for the first time in years, I am laughing again and actually like life once more. I moved to Ottawa for three months to be with my wife-to-be, and then, she got a transfer to Toronto, so we moved back here January 6. We are going to Kitchener, Ontario to "Lulu's" the longest bar in the world, for my 37th birthday on February 10, and then, to Pittsburgh, over Easter weekend, to visit my brother, sister-in-law and nephew (once we have the clutch fixed on the car).

I am now working for a temp agency as a wordprocessor at \$14.50 per hour, and in between contracts I collect unemployment insurance (as at the present). I know 10 software packages and hope to pick up "Ventura" so that I can perhaps get into desktop publishing, as this can pay up to \$26 or \$27 per hour. I would very much like to hear from anyone out there who knows anything at all about desktop publishing, particularly in terms of starting up one's own business.

I also hope to do some writing (papers, articles, reviews, editorials) for submission to professional journals and transgender publications. I am still selling "The Uninvited Dilemma" and the Research Supplement, as well as the "Standards of Care", and I hope to be able to sell "In Search Of Eve: Transsexual Rites of Passage", "Bodyshock": The Truth About Changing Sex", and perhaps, others. Regretably, I will not be able to make the IFGE convention in San Francisco in April as I had originally planned (due to "no moola"). I do hope to be able to attend the HBIGDA symposium on gender dysphoria in Cleveland in September. Take care till next time. Peace...

Please find enclosed a notice calling for participants in a research study on female-to-male transsexuals, and women who have lived as or become men. I have spoken with the researcher, Holly Devor (who is NOT a medical or helping professional, but rather, an anthropologist) and have offered to help her contact people such as you, who might be willing to assist in her study, in order that you may get the truth out about your lives, and also, so that Holly will have the necessary factual information to publish her book, GENDER BLENDING; When Two Is Not Enough. She has assured me that: 1) complete confidentiality will be observed at all times, 2) contacting her for further information implies no committment to participate in any further activities related to this or any other project, and 3) you may choose what parts of the project you wish to participate in if you prefer not to complete all parts. Your participation would include two interviews or a questionnaire about your life and two fill-in-the-blank tests. I sincerely hope that you care enough to help to educate the professional community and the general public on the rare phenomenon of female-to-male transsexualism and gender reassignment, by being a part of this study. I, personally, have already agreed to an interview by Ms. Devor because I feel this is a worthwhile study being conducted by a serious researcher who wishes to inform society about a very small percent of the population who have, or, who are trying to resolve their gender conflict. To date, there has been only one medical text (Lothstein's), two autobiographies (Martino's and Eliot's - unpublished), and one practical guide (Sullivan's) that deals with the subject of F-M TSism. Of course, I am working on my F-M TS manual and my personal memoirs, respectively, but there is still a tremendous need for additional literature on this topic. Please help to fill the void in this area by helping Holly to tell our story to the world. Thank you on behalf of F-M TSs everywhere. Please advise Ms Devor, when writing, that you were referred by me.

# FEMALE CROSS-DRESSERS OR FEMALE TO MALE TRANSSEXUALS

Participants wanted for a project about women who have lived as or become men.

#### THE QUESTIONS:

Where does it all begin? How does the decision to change get made? How is a change accomplished?

# THE PARTICIPANTS:

Persons who were born to the female sex and who have, at some point during their lives, lived as men with or without the aid of hormones and/or surgery. Female to male transsexuals. Lesbian or heterosexual women who have lived as men for a period of time and who have, or have not, returned to living as women at a later date.

## THE RESEARCHER:

Holly Devor. Feminist activist turned academic. Author of <u>Gender Blending: When</u> <u>Two is Not Enough</u>. Women's Studies instructor at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver, B.C., Canada. Ph.D. candidate at the University of Washington in Seattle, Wa., USA.

#### THE PROJECT:

Each participant will be asked to complete two interview sessions of 1–1.5 hours each and two short paper and pencil tests. Interviews will be audiotape recorded but strictest confidentiality will be observed. No one's identity will be revealed without their permission. Participants will be asked to describe their experiences of their sex/gender of origin and to compare them with their experiences of their sex/gender of choice. Participants will be asked to describe how they accomplished their passing for men or their sex/gender change for themselves, with family, friends, loved ones, co-workers, and in the public generally. Participants will also be asked to answer questions about what sex/gender means to them and to complete two short pencil and paper tests about sex/gender roles. Participants may refuse to answer any question or withdraw from the project at any time and for any reason.
