

1997 EAST COAST CONFERENCE

Quietly, and early in the afternoon on Saturday, March 22nd, representatives of the East Coast Courts gathered for their semi-annual meeting. Now two years old, the conference grew out of a need for the more than sixty local Courts of the International Court System to have some way to achieve better effective and more communication and mutual cooperation.

According to the Absolute Empress VII CoCo La Chine, it was felt that the best approach to achieve this would be to organize regional conferences under the leadership of the several Heirs Apparent. The first conference convened in Buffalo in 1995, hosted by Empress I Mimi La Rue and attended by representatives of nine Courts. Three goals were articulated at that very historic event: serve as a network and center for the exchange of information; write a protocol procedure manual; and to pool our resources to raise money more effectively and efficiently.

All three of the stated goals, most notably the third, has been achieved. On or about World AIDS Day, 1995, six of the Courts raised over \$10,000 for the Tijuana AIDS Project. The East Coast Courts the following year, again raised over \$10,000 to support Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS in the

U.S. and the Canadian counterpart.

The formulation of the protocol and procedure manual has of been considerable importance, not only for the new Baronies in Connecticut, Massachusettes and Ontario, but also to guide the already established Courts. This manual must be both flexible and comprehensive, particularly since no two Courts function in exactly the same way and they must accommodate and respond to different State, Provincial and Federal laws and policies. manual was presented at the Autumn, 1996, conference Toronto and is now being reviewed by the various Courts in our region before approved.

Finally, leading the way create a center for net-working and information exchange, the Imperial Court of Kentucky has set up a Web Site on the World Wide Web. Here, a Court member or casual inquirer can find official proclamations and news of the various Courts, as well as informal communications, conversations gossip. The Imperial Court of New York's participation is very coordinated by Princess Royale Blaise Patrice. This Web Site is the perhaps very embodiment of what described as one of the greatest accomplishments of the East Coast Conference achievement of a much greater sense of friendship camaraderie among the Courts and Courtiers here on the East Coast.
