Cross-Port is one year old this month, and girl have we grown in that time. On June 5, 1985 six people got together for the first time. Four of them had never talked to another TV or TS, two of them had talked to each other, and one of those two had been involved in groups on the west coast. So much for experience.

From that humble beginning and with the help of Tri-Ess, 66A, Tiffany/Tapestry, The Switchboard, and several other groups I expect to be mailing out over 100 "InnerViwes" this month. Considering, there are 22 others who once got our news letter but don't receive it any more I'd say "We've Come a Long Way Ladies".

I've tried to keep Cross-Port, alive and growing by offering new ideas, and things for us to do and by providing a safe, secure, constant meeting place. Our goal has been to offer support in a very real sense, by giving people a place to meet and talk to others like themselves, and by giving a feeling of acceptance. I feel we are doing that, and it is because of your support, your letters, your calls and your caring that I have been able to carry all this out. This is your Anniversary, even if you were not there at the first meeting. I've seen many of you come, frightened and scared, and grow very quickly into confident and self-accepting persons. I've head stories from some of you that say it has changed your whole life for the better, and from some that say it just knowing we are here it enough to keep you going. When I look back over the past year I don't just see a lot of long hours putting together the "InnerView", or the time spent cleaning the house, or the worry that "Tonight" no one is going to show up. I see growth, acceptance, caring and support and that is what makes the effort worth it, the results.

Dr. Richard Baum, who was with us at the April meeting sent me a news-letter called "Update on Human Behavior". The subject of this one was "The Quest for Intimacy" and while I recommend that all of you read it (it will be in the Library) I would like to quote from it.

"Defining intimacy can be difficult, but one explanation be might that intimacy is: a series of frequent contacts between two people; in close physical proximity; who share significant common goals; exchange personal information; and care deeply about one another.

Intimacy is the moment when we touch; when we reach past our usual social roles to say, in words and actions, 'This is who I am . . . really. This is what I fear. I want you to accept me. I want to know who you are, what you dream and what you fear. '

Intimacy is emotional understanding, a process of Knowing another human being with the heart rather than the head; not just intellectual understanding, but empathy. It is characterized by honesty, spontaneity, and easy sharing of feeling and ideas without fear of censure. "

That, to me, is what Cross-Port is about and wants to offer you. For some of us, it has been the first time in our lives that we have truly felt intimacy. The first time we could be who and what we are without fear.

I THANK ALL OF YOU for making this past year one of the most meaningful and intimate years of my life. I must say special thanks to Lily, Karen, Sarah, Linda, Sherry, Betty and Joanne for the work they have done to help share the load (each of you know what I mean) and to Sharon who has spent hours of time on the phone listening to MY problems, cheering Me up, and in general just being there when I needed some one to dump on. If I could have chose a better group of people to work and meet with in Cross-Port I don't know where I would have found them, because we have some of the best already. I believe God answers all prayers, sometimes it's "yes", sometimes it's "no", sometimes it's "maybe" and sometimes it's "in time" so most of all, I thank GOD for hearing my prayers and answering them with a "Yes, now it's time. "

Moving on, Betty who was planning to try to get a sub-group going in the Indy area has run into a snag and will not be able to do that at this time. If any of our Indy sisters would like to "volunteer" to give it a try write or call and let me know.

Many of you have said that you can't make it down here for meetings on Thursday night. We have found that in our area a weekend meeting would not really draw any more people just different people, and since "Paradise Club" has week-end meetings we feel that we offer an alternative for those that can't make it on week-ends. However, that doesn't mean we don't do things on the week-ends. Some one from our group, usually is going out on the week-ends so if you want to come to town on a week-end there is almost always something going on.

The response to the request for money to help the National Convention has been underwelming. A total of \$5 from one person has been received. I do hope this is not a sign of the turn out we can expect. You all have paid more than that for a pair of panties or a tube of lipstick.

Finally, one last word about our new meeting place. We have a chance to start the second year of Cross-Port in a new home. I know for some it will be a new and frightening experience, but in many ways it is more private, and easier to walk into than the home of a person that you don't know. Please give it a chance.
