His anonymous (as it is to gather information on one's perceptions, preferences and philosophies of Gays in total) "Questionnaire" asks some of


the following questions:

Dear President Clinton,

I, together with many others, am writing to express my strong support of your policy to eliminate the ban which prohibits American Citizens who are gay or lesbian from serving in the United States Military. I believe that this ban is an unacceptable challenge to the civil rights that all American citizens cherish. It also deprives a potential employer - The United States of America - of a resource of competent individuals because of irrelevant criteria.

As you have repeatedly said, people entering the military, or other professions, should not be prejudged nor should they be stereotyped. People need to be seen as individuals - all responsible for their own behavior. Know that your support of these beliefs has been heard and applauded.

In recent years, each generation of Americans has had to confront injustices in our society, and each person has had to consult the Constitution and his or her conscience as positions are determined. This ban causes all of us to be faced with another threat to our civil rights. We need to cast aside prejudices, stereotypes and narrow interests. I ask you to continue to take a stand for justice by opposing this irrational ban prohibiting people to serve in the military simply because of sexual orientation. You are making history! Please continue to seize the opportunity.

I am proud that you have taken this position for civil rights. Know that you do not stand alone, and count on me for your support.

Hitting the Pavement for Gay Pride

The music and dancing would soon follow. But for a moment, the festive atmosphere of the Long Island Gay Pride Parade in Huntington yesterday gave way to silence and reflection.

The reason was Allen Schindler, whose portrait was held high at the front of the parade units.

The gay sailor, who was beaten to death in Japan last fall by a shipmate, "was murdered because of hate and ignorance," said Steve Henaghan, a parade organizer.

The focus on Schindler, at the beginning of the march, was part of the parade's military theme. Organizers even appropriated the Army slogan, "Be All You Can Be," as they criticized the military's ban on gays.

"We're going to serve up a loud message that we're not going to stand for this," said David Kilmnick, another organizer and member of the Long Island Pride Committee, sponsor of the third annual parade, which drew several thousand marchers and spectators.

"It's time for the military to deal with reality," said Rene A. Puliatti. He said he served in the U.S. Navy for five years before resigning in 1990 with an honorable discharge after telling his superiors he was gay.

Puliatti, 30, a Syracuse native who now lives in Hoboken, N.J., said the military is "wasting our country's resources because of a lot of irrational fears."

In addition to bringing issues to the fore, the parade helps to showcase diversity in the gay and lesbian community, said one observer.

Participants included motorcycle club members, country and western line dancers, female impersonators and others from a variety of agencies and groups.

"We have to show people that we're just like everybody else," said Patrick Lieta of Copiague. "I think it's extremely important not to be invisible.'

Participants were anything but invisible as they marched along New York Avenue, down Main Street and into the Town Hall parking lot for a rally.

Supporters lined the route, cheering the marchers on. One mother wore a sign that read: "Straight Mom for Gay Rights."

But not everyone approved. Donna Carlino of Huntington wore a sign saying, "Jesus Can Set You Free." She said she thought the marchers were misguided, "but I still think that God loves them. I'm here to share that with them, not to condemn them."

Unlike the parade's rocky start in 1991, when the Town of Huntington initially withheld a permit for the group until a federal judge intervened, everything was smooth for the second straight year.

Kilmnick said the town had provided electrical power, a staging platform for the rally and portable toilets.


"We're now a tradition on Long Island and in Huntington," Kilmnick told the cheering throng.
