THINK ABOUT IT " Transgendered people have probably existed in all cultures, across all ages. So it is safe to assume that there are people like you in your community. How many? The only estimate from sex researchers and therapists applies to transvestites. They guess that 5 percent of the adult male American population has the need to crossdress. If there are 10,000 adult males in your community, you could estimate that 500 of them are transvestites. But only a handful of them may accept themselves or lead a life that would permit them to join a support group. And even fewer would be willing to undertake the effort to get such a group organized... " And, "...
