Our New Meeting Place

When we walked into the large yellow Victorian mansion, our first sight was that of the main entrance room and we were startled by its size. With a dimension of at least 50' by 30' there seemd to be enough room to park a dozen cars and still have room left over. A high ceiling, chairs and couches surround the perimeter of the room and a movable partition can be closed to block of



approximately 30% of the area, creating two separte rooms.

Passing through the entrance room, we found ourselves in a winding corrridor with cost racks on the left, and a doorway on the right that led us into a kitchen that can only be described as gigantic. Walking up the stairs I pulled back a large curtain backdrop and exposed a working fireplace that looked as though it had been shipped over from Windsor Castle. It was amazing. As I looked at Charliss and Molly, tears began to fill my eyes. We had finally found a place befitting the grandest of our expectations.

Business Meeting Held

On August 18, 1990, E.O.N. beld its monthly busines meeting. Elven members, 3 significant others and two guest were in attendance. Charliss introduced the new members, Cathy, Marsha and Melissa and they were welcomed to E.O.N.

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The board of directors were introduced. They are:

Charliss announced that the Autumn Accord pamphlets would be ready by August 20 and would soon be distributed to other groups.

Angela announced that she would be meeting with two local doctors to establish a mutually beneficial relationship between E.O.N. and the medical community.

Angela reported that a response to ber letter to the city police department had been received. The letter informed the police of E.O.N. and the Autumn Accord. The response was "How can we belp?"

Two local retailers have given thier permission for members to shop the stores and use the dressing rooms according to Charliss. These retailers are 16plus at Camillus Hall and Boom Babies on the corner of Wescott and Beech streets. It was also suggested that Margret, in the cosmetic department at the downtown Addis & Deys, has been very belpful and maintains files on several E.O.N. girls.

Molly offered the treasurers report. As of August 18, 1990, our account balance was \$607.67. After adding in bank charges, donations and printing costs, that amount was amended to \$557.37.

Molly reported on the various laws affecting crossdressers. It was concluded after discussing the matter, that members should carry thier male ID's and give thier male names when asked by the authorities, (excluding our TS members) and if they are not soliciting, they should not fear arrest.

The possibility of incorporation as a not-for-profit organization was discussed.

A three person by-laws committee was formed. Angela, Molly and Diana were selected to serve on the committee.

Chris H. and Ted B. representing Alternative Efforts of Central N. Y. were introduced and spoke briefly. It was through them that E.O.N. found it's new meeting place. The role of E.O.N. in the alternative lifestyle community was also discussed.

Jackie submitted a report on the Autumn Accord and a plea for help from the members at large was made.

Charliss offered a report on membership. E.O.N. currently has 24 members with two more screenings planned.

The meeting was ajourned and a good time was had by all.

The Presidents Corner

Opportunity

What a wonderful opportuity E.O.N. is for all of us who choose to see it this way. Some of us saw it this way when it was just a name that had become disconnected from the original couples club it had once represented.

There it was: Just this name that, at one time, meant something to a group of

 crossdressers and their wives, and now serving mosyly as a reminder of the past.

We chose to see it differently - anew. The issue here for all of us is really the issue of creativity. How do we create opportunity for ourselves as crossdressers, whether TV or TS, single or married, whatever our individual orientation in this life? The answer, I believe, applies to all aspects of our lives.

What we want in our lives - what we need what we desire, is called content. This content might include a dinner out en femme, a banquet with a prominent speaker, a change in employment status, a new pair of high beels (I'm serious...), a new degree of authenticity in a relationship, increased self esteem, an expanded circle of friendships, the ability to come and go in society as either man or woman - you name it.

Now...none of this just happens. We will never just wake up one morning and find all, or any, of this just sitting under the tree. The time is past for that.

Creativity is called for. We create the context in which what we need and desire can happen. That is our responsibility, as individuals and as a group - to create that space, that context. It is much the same as having this wonderful variety of seeds call them desires or ideas - and a vision of the fruit. If there is not the corresponding growth opporitunity for these seeds - soil, water, etc. - then we need to create a field of growth.

Context is created out of choice. The past - whether it be the individual's past or society's - need not be our present or our future. Resignation to the way things are, or appear to be, need not be our fate, our only "realistic" response.

There is an old story about a group of people who had attained the most important thing in their lives, and they were having one of their regular get-togethers when they were visited by some newcomers who were attracted to what this group had achieved for themselves. The "old timers" talked a little about the road they had traveled prior to their achievement - our their lack of it - and shared some thoughts about their present life and their abundance.

The newcomers were impressed, especially since they found that they could identify with these people on a feeling level as they shared their past. Most importantly, the newcomers wanted to share in the abundance that was so evident.

They were told this: "If you have decided you want what we have and are willing to go to any lengths to get it, then you are ready to take certain steps. We had balked at some of these steps. We thought we could find an easier and softer way, but we could not."

The "old timers" then outlined these "certain steps". Actually, they were talking about creating the opportunity, the context in which the most important things could happen.

There are many reasons why E.O.N. - the new E.O.N. as an open group - was created. The one thing to remember is that E.O.N. was created to provided the context in which our individualities could be expressed, a field of opportunity or growth wherein this expression could continue to unfold.

In order to create this context, we had to be willing to take certain steps which most of us initially considered to be risky, for example, revealing our nature to non-crossdressers in order to secure facilities, services and cooperation. There were other steps we had to take - and more we have yet to take - as individuals and as a group in order to expand and grow in terms of social stature and personal self esteem. Many of these steps will involve risk and vulnerability. The motivation, the desire, the vision of a "break-through" experience needs to be strong indeed to reinforce the willingness to take these "certain steps".

In order to accomodate the natural tendency of human beings to grow, unfold, and expand, E.O.N. will have to grow as well in order to continue to be of service. As context, it will have to be re-oreated again and again. This will have to occur on a conscious level, intentionally. This too, like the context, will never just appear under the tree one morning.

Each and every one of us, crossdressers and significant others, has this tremendous and wonderful dimension deep within that has to unfold to lesser or greater degrees. I believe that this dimension is spiritual in nature, and that it expresses itself in a multitude of individual ways.

We have, each and everyone of us, the opportunity to choose our experience with E.O.N. as the context in which this dimension can unfold and grow. This way we will not only be helping ourselves, we will be assisting others.

Directions to the New E.O.N. Meeting Place

North Bound on 1-81:

- 1.) Take Baldwinsville exit in center of city.
- 2) Travel 3/4 mile and take West Street exit.
- 3.) Continue on West Street until it ends at Onondaga Street.
- 4.) Turn right and go to next light.
- 5.) Turn left onto Midland Ave.
- 6.) Turn right into first driveway behind funeral home on the corner of Onondaga and Midland Ave.
- 7.) Drive straight back to large yellow victorian house behind church. Entrance at handicap ramp.

South Bound 1-81:

- 1.) Take West Street exit entering the city. Bear right to the light.
- 2.) Cross intersection and go up ramp to West Street.
- 3.) Follow directions above.

East Bound Rt. 690:

- 1.) Follow sign to 690 West Bound.
- 2.) Take West Street exit entering the city.
- 3.) Follow directions above.

West Bound Rt. 690:

- 1.) Take exit for West Street & Genesee Street.
- 2.) Stay to your left on exit ramp to West Street.
- 3.) Follow directions above.
