Subject: GOP Assembly Candidate, Lesbian, Transsexual, opposes Knight Initiative and endorses many GLBT issues

Liz Michael, open lesbian and admitted transsexual, is running for the Republican nomination for the California State Assembly in the 43rd District, and she has not only come out against the Knight Initiative, but serves on Speakers Bureau for it, and supports many gay and transgender rights issues even her Democratic opponents are afraid to touch.

Liz Michael, in opposition to most of the legislators of her party, supports the civil rights of sexual minorities. "This is one of the major reasons I decided to run in this election. It truly sickens me that a small number of people with power have this

fear that somehow and in some way that allowing sexual minorities to have the rights that every other individual has in this country concerning work, marriage and family would somehow injure them. Also, continuing to make sexual minorities a scapegoat is a divisive tactic, and as such should rightfully be relegated to the ash heap of history. It has to stop, and it is critical to the survival of the Republican Party that is does. And those of us conservatives who believe that have a duty to stand up and say 'enough is enough'."

Liz Michael is currently the Chief Executive Officer and Vice President of Operations for Analon, Inc. an Arizona based computer manufacturing corporation. She was the Republican nominee for the State Assembly in 1990 in a district including Burbank and Los Angeles, and has sought office four previous times going back to a 1988 run for the California State Senate. She is an open lesbian, although she does make it clear that she is not exclusively so, and she is also the first transsexual to run for the California Legislature, having done it 12 years ago.

"I feel that the citizens of California need me to represent them and that the California Republican Party needs me for leadership. I see little to no representation for my own political point of view, and given that this is will likely be a contentious election for an open seat, this election represents a dual opportunity. To bring forth the message of the small business person and average citizen in an election where it would otherwise not be heard, and to have that message heard in the halls of the legislature where it will be difficult, given who I am and what I do, for it to be ignored. Being able to promote GLBT issues in the legislature, would be a bonus for me.

Same Sex Partners: Make Your Family Count in the 2000 Census

In March and April 2000, the United Sates Census Bureau will mail a census form to each American household. This year, as in 1990, the Census form will include a question critical to our ability to determine the scope and shape of same-sex couples and their children who share a household. The form allows for two adults who are living together to designate their relationship as "Unmarried Partners." When the census is completed, information about the numbers and demographics of same-sex unmarried couples will be available.

When the census was taken in 1990, the Census Bureau did not count any answer by a same-sex couple who marked "spouse" to describe their relationship. The Bureau considered it a mistake because it is legally impossible for same-sex couples to marry. This year the Census Bureau has indicated that it will simply re-categorize the answer from "spouse" to "unmarried partner" so the data is not lost. The safest bet for being counted is to describe a same-sex relationship in its legal term "unmarried partner". This will ensure that your family is counted.

"I believe my mere presence in the legislature by itself would represent a great leap forward for people of all ethnicities and all sexual realities. Having Liz Michael in the California Legislature changes the equation in so many ways, and in my opinion, all for the good."

What are some of these issues? There are the traditional, such as rights of gays to serve in the military, anti-discrimination protections based on sexual orientation, allowance and protection of domestic partnership agreements, and opposition to so-called "Defense Of Marriage Initiatives" like California's Knight Initiative, Proposition 22. Then there are the controversial. Like openly supporting the rights of same-sex couples to marry, and a host of transgender issues that even the most liberal Democratic representatives are afraid to touch.

Liz Michael comes from a colorful background that has included everything from a University of Pennsylvania Wharton School Degree, and an accounting and tax background, in which she still is employed by the occasional client, to unsuccessful entrees into the music industry and even involvement in the professional wrestling industry: she used to be a reporter assigned to cover WWF events and her wrestler gimmick name is "The Taskmistress". She was the host and producer of "Lady Liberty" a political debate cable show for four seasons. Generally, she is an economic conservative and a social libertarian.

"I am not the so-called 'Ideal Candidate From Central Casting'. I'm not the square woman in the, suburb with a husband, 2.5 children and a picket fence, who has never done anything embarrassing in her life. What I am is a real person. And anyone who knows me knows that I am more than willing to rock the boat and shake up the political establishment, and goodness knows that the political establishment needs shaking up."

Many have speculated about the possibility of transsexuals successfully running for office. "Ten years ago when I ran, it was a controversial thing. So it was something I preferred to keep in the background. Even now, I do not want to be known as a "transsexual candidate or a "lesbian candidate" because it distracts from the agenda I wish to see in government. But I do believe that a great deal of progress has been made in this area, in terms of acceptance of us as people. I believe even Republicans will understand the arguments made on behalf of sexual minorities

if someone with an interest comes forth to make them. So I feel, for a myriad of reasons, that it is my duty to run. I think the time has come to address these issues legislatively."

Liz Michael is no moderate. She is an arch libertarian conservative with philosophies very similar to Rep. Ron Paul, Rep. Dana Rohrbacher, economist Milton Friedman. She is endorsed by the Republican Liberty Caucus. She is ardently pro gun rights, eschewing some of even the most modest gun control proposals.

"I'm easily the most conservative candidate filed in this election to date. This is why I believe my open stance on these issues to be so germane to the argument. With my candidacy I hope to change the political landscape on the issue of the rights of sexual minorities in a major way, and hopefully, with my election to the Assembly I will continue to do so."


