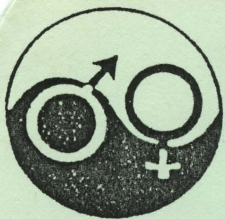

Dear Women Friends,

I simply must take advantage of our two ambassadors coming over to Provincetown, to send you my warmest greetings and tell you how very much I shall miss your wonderful coffee mornings. In fact, I miss them the whole year round. I saw so much warmth and true kinship amongst you that I actually found it quite moving. There is something wonderfully sustaining in such a bond and I find it all the more surprising as I am myself a member of a women's self-help group over here; we meet up once a month to thrash out any worries we may have, and this works quite well, but our gatherings quite definitely lack the warmth and spontaneity that I witnessed - and briefly became part of - at your own meetings. I have been trying to think why this is and have come to the conclusion that it may be due to an ingredient that you Americans have and we over here lack; we seem to be so much more introspect, formal and somewhat colder. Or maybe part of the answer lies with the fact that you all share a great common factor in your life with your husbands and partners turning themselves into "girls". Whatever the answer, I thought your coffee mornings were tops, and one of the events I looked forward to most on returning to Fantasia Fair last October. I would not have missed them for the world.

So please accept my warmest greetings for your forthcoming "season" of coffee mornings, and all I can add is:-
