#### VICE-PRESIDENT - Membership Development

1. Supervise membership recruitment, orientation, activation and retention activies.

2. Maintain the Chapter "Hot" line and direct messages and queries to appropriate channels.

3. Maintain a log of all calls into the chapter with particular emphasis on potential threats.

4. She shall be responsible to respond to interested parties with appropriate literature by mail.

5. She shall be responsible to make a report at the monthly board meeting.

6. Develop program of outreach

7. Make an annual report to the membership in the monthly newsletter

#### VICE-PRESIDENT - Programming

1. Shall be responsible for securing and/or developing suitable guest speakers or programs for the chapter meetings.
