## TRANSVESTITE FOUND DEAD

Marsha P. Johnson, (aka Malcolm Michaels, Jr.), survivor of the 1969 Stonewall Rebellion, internationally acclaimed entertainer with the Hot Peaches Review, Andy Warhol model, Anvil icon, and a legendary prostitute on Christopher Street and the West Side Highway was found floating in the Hudson River at Christopher Street late Monday afternoon on July 6, 1992.

At the time of her death, Marsha, a much beloved fixture in the Village for many years, was wearing men's clothing. She apparently drowned three or four days earlier, Thursday July 2nd, or Friday July 3rd. The body was so badly decomposed that surviving family members - brother and sisters, Robert, Jean, and Norma Michaels of Elizabeth, New Jersey - were not allowed to view either the body or photos for identification purposes.
