This month we celebrate National Cross-dressing month. Come in your finest costume. Dig out those items you have been dying to wear.



Miranda Why Did She Wear THAT T-Shirt? by Miranda Stevens

I expected to take a lot of good-natured ribbing, which I did. And that was fine, I loved it! I was surprised at the genuine curiosity about what it really meant, the hidden message. And that was fine too, although I was too hurried to give an adequate explanation at the time. What I really didn't expect were the few (very few) hostile comments. And that wasn't fine at all!

I'm referring to the Transexual Menace T-shirt which I wore as part of my outfit at the Chi Chapter September meeting. If you were one of the unfortunate few who missed that meeting, you might not know that it was a '50s-'60s coffeehouse theme program, complete with folksingers and poets. The spirit of protest against the establishment pervaded the '60s, and I felt that wearing my Menace T-shirt made an appropriate statement, entirely in line with the evening's program.

For those of you who were genuinely curious, I owe a better explanation. The Transexual Menace is a nationwide web of transgendered activists who boldly face society and let them know, in no uncertain terms, when the human rights of transgendered people have been violated.

When one of our community has been killed, you can bet the TS Menace will be holding a public vigil to draw attention to transviolence. When your civil rights are denied, you can bet the TS Menace will be knocking on the door of your Senator or Representative. When professionals abuse children in the guise of treating their "gender disorder", you can bet the TS Menace will be protesting it.

But what does the TS Menace have to do with Tri-Ess? Well, the answer to that is "Nothing and everything!" There are no ties, official or otherwise, between our two organizations. So that is the nothing part. On the other hand, the abuse of rights and discrimination which is being addressed by the Menace is something which affects all of us.

Several people asked if I was coming out as a transsexual by wearing that T-shirt. Well, no, it was not a personal gender identity statement. I'm hetero and a crossdresser, just like (most of) you. But when people read us on the street, what they see is a transsexual. They don't have the knowledge to recognize the fine distinction between a CD and a TS. We're all the same to most of society. For that matter, they don't distinguish between gay and straight. To the rest of the world, we're transsexual, gay, and a threatening menace to the foundations of their society.

So when the TS Menace demonstrates for transsexual rights, they are demonstrating for <u>your</u> rights. And when gay activist groups, like Queer Nation, stands up for gay rights, they are standing up for <u>your</u> rights! Because that is how you are perceived by the rest of the world!

Back in the '60s, I was active in the civil rights movement. I marched in Washington DC and in New York City. I was there when Martin Luther King spoke to the assembled masses and told them of his dream. Some my proudest memories come from knowing that I, in a very small way, was part of changing the world for the better. I didn't have to be a black man to know that this was the right thing to do. I felt just as alienated from society as they did, and I wanted to make the statement that everyone, regardless of ethnic origin, beliefs, or gender (in the broadest

I must tell you about my first night "out" en femme. I attended my first Chi-Tri-Ess meeting along with Sandy, my "significant other", and we had a wonderful time. It was "touch and go" for awhile as to whether or not I was actually going to go at all. First I was going and then I wasn't going and then I was going again...I vacillated all day long on Saturday and when it finally came time to go I asked Sandy what I should do. She said "Don't ask me sweetie pie, this is YOUR life, not mine". At the last moment I decided that we really should go and I am soooo glad that we did.

When we arrived at the Holiday Inn and located the meeting room there were only a few people there but they came right over and welcomed us and made us feel right at home. I changed into my femme outfit and Sandy helped me with my make-up. As more and more people arrived many of them came right up and introduced themselves and welcomed us to the group. I even met some people who lived in the same area of Chicago where I grew up and we had a kind of old neighborhood reunion and "catch-up-on-gossip" session. Needless to say it was a very friendly atmosphere. About 6:30 there were two separate meetings held in rooms adjoining the main meeting room. One was for newcomers which I attended and one was a P.A.L.S (short for Positive Attitudes Living Side by side) meeting for spouses which Sandy attended. The newcomer's meeting was very nice. I met about 12 other people with experiences similar to that of my own and we got to know each other a little bit.

The main meeting started about 8:15 or so and after the necessary announcements and regular business the entertainment for the evening began.

The theme was "Beatnik Night" and several people went up on stage to entertain the crowd. Now get this... I was one of them! The entertainment director, Miranda, who is a truly lovely person inside and out, had gone around before the meeting asking for help because they had been a little light on volunteers. I said that in a pinch I would volunteer to do something if they needed another act. Well, to my amazement I was "pinched" and I got up on stage with my knees knocking to say the least and did a little skit based upon a popular little Robert Frost poem about ants.

Apparently the crowd liked it or so they indicated by their clapping. It probably would have been a flop in front of a regular crowd but these people are so polite that it doesn't take much effort to get their applause. I think that is because we appreciate each other so much. Well, anyway, my ears are still ringing with all the compliments and it goes without saying that this doesn't hurt in boosting one's self esteem. The other acts were much, much better than mine by the way. There was a poet named Stacey who recited some of her works and a musician named Amanda who performed a duet with her teenage son and did a medley of hit songs from the sixties and seventies. These are verrry talented people! I was just a fill-in.

The evening just flew by. There were refreshments and lot's of good conversation with new friends. Then all too soon it was time for this shining little diamond to turn back into an old lump of coal and hop back into the pumpkin for the trip back to the barn. In the afterglow of the evening as we drove home we decided that the venture had been a smashing success and when I told Sandy that I would like to do it again she quickly

I support the Transexual Menace. These are my rights that I am demonstrating for this time. And I support Queer Nation, because these are my rights also.

I know what I am, and I am comfortable with my gender identity. And I support the mission of Tri-Ess, which is to be a focused social support group for the crossdresser and his family. It should stay that way because the need is there. But we need to acknowledge that we are all part of a larger community. And that community includes gays, lesbians, bisexuals, transsexuals (both M2F and F2M), drag queens and kings, etc. When one of us is denied our rights, we all are.

The '60s was the decade for civil rights. This is our '60s. Let's made the '90s the decade for gender rights. The decade for freedom of expressional and affectional orientation. And I hope that when all of this is achieved, you will look proudly back at the '90s and say, "I helped do that!"

TS Menace Action to Protest GID Misuse

Gender Identity Disorder (GID) Classification is being misused by members of the American Psychiatric Association (APA) to "treat" non-complaining gender-variant children as young as 2-4, including young crossdressers whose parents simply fear the stigma of queer offspring. Treatment runs the gamut from basic psychotherapy to round-the-clock reward-punishment regimes of behavior modification, to forcible institutionalization in a psychiatric ward, sometimes complete with thorazine, haldol or other psycho-active drugs.

A peaceful demonstration has been called by members of the Chicago, Connecticut, NYC and Boston chapters of the direct action group the Transexual Menace to protest this abuse. It is to be held outside the APA's national meeting in Chicago on Saturday, October 19 at 10:00 a.m. at the Chicago Marriott Downtown at 540 N. Michigan Ave. All members and friends of the Chicago area TG community are invited to participate.

Debbie Johnson of It's Time Wisconsin, which is joining in the protest, points out it is important to distinguish legitimate from illegitimate uses of the GID classification. "We are not protesting the right of informed individuals to seek for themselves the classification for obtaining medical and psychological care and reimbursement. We will be protesting the misuse of the classification to enforce gender norms and to pathologize gender variance which merely makes people uncomfortable."
