Safety Tips for Women Who Drive Alone

For many women, driving alone is a fact of life. Every day millions of women get into their cars taking personal safety for granted. Whether traveling to the grocery store or cross-country, precautions should be taken before and during driving to protect yourself and your possessions.

The American Automobile Association (AAA) provides a number of tips for improving personal safety both when entering and/or exiting your car and while driving.

- Always park in a central, well-lighted place.
- Keep your keys in your hand as you approach your parked car. Don't wait until you reach the car to search for them in your purse.
- Check the back seat before getting into the car, even if you left it with the door 1685kest
- If you notice someone suspicious near your car, walk in a different direction toward a public place and seek help.

The first step to improving personal safety while driving is to keep your car in good mechanical condition. By doing so, you

avoid being stranded on the road due to a breakdown. However, women who drive alone also need to be aware of other rules to increase safety:

- · Lock all doors and toll up the windows while you drive.
- Never pick up hitchhikers.
- If your car becomes disabled, lock yourself in and turn on the four-way flashers until the police come.
- If you have a flat tire in a dark or dangerous location, drive slowly to the nearest service station or public place. Even if you ruin the tire, you will not have risked your life.
- Avoid short cuts that take you through unfamiliar or unsafe areas.
- If your car is rammed from behind and the hit seems deliberate, stay in the car with the doors locked. Wait for the police to arrive.

Finally, it's always a good idea to let someone else know where you are going, when you are expecting to leave and arrive, etc. Leave an itinerary of your trip with a relative or someone whom you speak with regularly and who would miss your call if something happened.

By keeping these simple suggestions in mind, you can not only protect yourself and your possessions, you could also save your life!
