HISTORY

Some of us heard what a good job they were doing on the West Coast and decided we needed something for this paraculture in the East. We wanted a hospitable setting where we could conduct workshops and seminars, have boutiques, Fashion Shows and Talent Shows and for an opportunity to experience an active social life "en femme".

Provincetown proved to be such a place and in 1975 with a little seed money and large expectations we planned the first Fantasia Fair. Negotiations seemed endless. A few weeks before the Fair was to open, the hotel we planned to stay in declared bankcruptcy. However, all the obstacles were surmounted and the Fair began October 15th with 30 participants. The program included a Fashion/Beauty Course, a Fashion Show, numerous mini-boutiques, a Film Festival and the Awards Banquet. It was a huge success.

Since that year there has been a Fantasia Fair every October in Provincetown. This year will be the seventh. Symposiums, Town & Gown Suppers, and Workshops/Seminars have been added - as has the Pool Party. Participants now come from all over the United States, Europe, Canada and Mexico. And each year seems better than last.

Each year a different coordinator and staff works to make the Fair a reality. Fashion & Beauty Course

A Fashion and Beauty Course was offered at Fantasia Fair dealing with the practical aspects of femme self expression. Under Ms. Paula's careful guidance, participants were shown the art of applying cosmetics to the face. Mr. Preston showed how to style your hair or wig to bring out your natural features. The Seminars

Outreach Institute

This seminar presented the educational objectives of the Institute for the Crossdresser/Transsexual/ Androgyny community and helping professionals. There were special reports on the full range of problems and services offered by the Institute. Discussion included how the Outreach Institute has made its impact on helping professionals, this paraculture, and the general public.





Sociological Aspects

Here concern was centered on some of the fundmental aspects and attitudes of crossgender behaiors. These included the elements of "passing," the nature of the "satin doll" image, passing versus life style, finding employment in the femme mode, and the nature of "social cueing" and its importance the process of successful femme transition.

Legal Aspects

Under the direction of a team of lawyers, some of the issues covered included; what the law says about crossdressing, how to find legal counsel to help people with legal aspects of crossgender issues, how to deal with the questions of "blackmail," and what are your legal rights with regard to jobs and your children.
