

Imperial Queens "Act-Up"

Imperial Queen Allyson and King Farrell were in attendance representing IQKNY at ACT-UP's Tenth Anniversary party. The celebratory event took place on Saturday, March 22nd at the *avant-gard* performance and party space called P.S. 122 in NYC's East Village. Many other prominent people who are known for their hard work in the battle with the AIDS crisis were present to help mark a ten-year milestone for ACT-UP. ACT-UP (AIDS Coalition To Unleash Power) is a fearless political and civil rights organization that stands up for the rights of those who have HIV and AIDS. Two days later on March 24th, some IQK members joined ACT-UP in a triumphant demonstration against Wall Street. The protest was in the financial district since Wall Street maintains and advances the causes of large pharmaceutical companies charging exorbitant prices for key drugs to treat AIDS. Queen Christy Lynne Belle gave a wonderful representation of our group. The event was sponsored by The Center's Gender Identity Project. A healthy community is a strong community. The conference was a valuable opportunity to gain access to information, network with and meet other individuals and also a fun way to spend some time. Entertainment and refreshments were also provided. Many thanks goes to Roz Blumenstein, director of GIP, for helping to provide an exceptional event. Roz is also a good friend of IQK and was a guest speaker at our April business and social meeting. She herself is a wonderful advertisement for a dignified and intelligent transgendered person.

On May 10th there was a Prom Night that was more faboulous than any senior prom of any high school. The Dance Committee of The Center (208 W. 13th St., NYC) held a dance with a Prom theme and invited Imperial Queen Allyson and Imperial King Storme to be on the judging panel for the Prom Queen and Prom King contest. The Center was

crawling with people trying to look like fresh, young, virginal, school girls. Well, at least they were trying. Queen Allyson dazzled the crowd as she performed the Gay anthem = "This is My Life", made famous by Shirley Bassey. The winner of the Prom Queen contest was our very own V. P. Queenette Tina Rapport, who was a wearing a beautiful, frilly, powder-blue, girlish gown. The title of Prom King went to the Drag King performer Moe B. Dyck, who strutted his macho, butch charm on stage. Tina and Moe made such a cute couple. Many of the dance participants followed the American tradition of losing (or re-losing) their virginity on Prom night. Well, at least they tried.

IQK & Brooklyn Pride

Countess Clovoria bewitched the audience at the first fundraiser for Brooklyn Pride on Friday, April 4th, at a dance that took place at The Gay Center in Manhattan. Imperial Queens & Kings were the very first organization to sign-up to take part in Brooklyn's first Gay Pride Parade and entertainment rally. Jerry and Daysha, of Brooklyn Pride, first announced the news of Brooklyn Gay Pride and requested IQK to lead the parade at our 28th Anniversary Party in Nov. of '96. Countess Clovoria and Count Yaro aroused the audience when they sang at a Brooklyn Pride open-mike event on Wednesday night on April 16th at Spectrum, the Brooklyn disco where "Saturday Night Fever" was filmed. Imperial Queens & Kings were honored to be attending the opening of The Bronx Lavender Community Center on April 26th. Called a "Unity Open House", there was a warm reception and ribbon cutting ceremony with The Bronx Boro President and former '97 NYC mayoral candidate and a dear friend to our group, Fernando Ferrer cutting the ribbon. Ferrer also was an honored guest speaker at our March business and social meeting. The entertainment for the event was superbly provided by Kontessa Kitt Holiday and Marquessa Michelle, who just so happen to be among our finest and most talented entertainers. Both ladies dazzled the crowd with their live singing voices and stunning stage presence.

Queenly In Philly

On May 11th, Philadelphia, PA got a taste of Imperial glamour and talent when our entertainment chairlady Kontessa Kitt Holiday took part in that city's Pridefest '97. With the Imperial Queens in town, "The City of Brotherly Love" quickly transformed into "The City of Sisterly Love". Kitt captivated the Philly residents and visitors with her live vocals and stunning stage presence. She belted out "It's All Right With Me", "Them There Eyes" and other musical numbers. Since the Imperial Queens left town the Liberty Bell will never ring the same again.

Imperial Queen "Voices" Her Opinion

The March 18th issue of *The Village Voice* ran a two-page feature story on "Mayoress Rudia", who publicly stated that she was "inspired by the Imperial Queens of NYC". The article was titled "Drag Queens Rate Rudia" and our own Queen Allyson was prominently interviewed. As many of you know, Queen Allyson praises Rudia and spoke highly of her to *The Village Voice*, praising her appearance and voice. Other famous drag queens interviewed were Lipsync and Lady Bunny, who praised Rudia's make-up and hair-do. Gossip Diva Michael Musto was also interviewed and said less flattering things about Rudia. This confused some people since many readers knew Musto was a Queen but didn't know he was a Drag Queen. Musto is another dear friend of IQKNY and we call her Mona.

Queen Allyson's Tapestry


Transgender Art Celebrated at the Guggenheim

A unique and exciting art exhibit celebrating Transgender people, Transgender expression and Transgender being was on display at the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum in NYC from January 17th through April 27th. Art in the exhibit included works from famous artists such as Andy Warhol, who provided a delightful self-portrait in drag, Claude Cahun, Man Ray, Lucas Samaras, Marcel Duchamp, Inez Van Lamsweerde, Robert Mapplethorpe and others. Imperial Queens & Kings members including Countess Clovoria, Count Yaro and Lady Karen Bee were among those attending a reception. The exhibit was called "A Rose is a Rose is a Rose". Many artists have deliberately set out to question and explore sexuality and gender. Some comment upon mass media by appropriating the formal and technological means of its representations. One gallery featured works created in the period between the two World Wars. Another featured more contemporary works such as the Surrealists' creative explorations of love and the mysteries of human sexuality. All the art acknowledges that gender and the expressions of gender have provided a fertile milieu for artists. There will be more Transgender art exhibits in the future.

The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, also called New York's "spiral" museum is located at 1071 Fifth Avenue (at East 89th Street) in New York City. Museum hours are 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. on

Sundays through Wednesdays; 10:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays. The Museum is closed on Thursdays. For more information about the museum and directions call (212) 423-3500.


