Season's greetings and the happiest of new year's to all members, associates and friends of Chi Chapter! May your lives be blessed with joy and cheer throughout this upcoming year.

1989 was a most quiet year in comparison of the past years for Chi Chapter and its members. Chicago did host the Seventh Annual Be All You Want To Be Weekend which drew 285 official registrants - representing 27 states and 2 foreign countries! And there was the usual outreach programs with members speaking to classes at several colleges and universities in the Mid-West, but total activity was below that of '87 & '88.

We are now entering the last decade of the 20th century. So what does 1990 hold for us. I am sure that we all have many conceptions of what is to be, but for now, let us look back at where we came in the '80's.



Back in 1980, I was Chi Chapter's President; our Vice-President was Kay, who later was to move to California, and Donna Martin, now National Tri-Ess

membership Director, was our Secretary/Treasurer. Chi Chapter had just ventured out of the closet of home and motel meetings to the public's eyeview at places like the Lite Factory and the Factory. We had an infamous meeting at which Kay brought four "hookers" as 'quests'!

And, yes, Naomi had yet to attend a Tri-Ess affair.

During the '80's, Karen Baumgarden, now of C.G.S., was to become a chapter Vice-President; we were to find a permanent 'home' at the Midway Motor Lodge; the first of many guest therapists were to attend and lead us in group discussions; the number of wives and partners to



attend began to increase; and, in June, 1983, Chi Chapter members were to make their first appearance on

National Television when Mary Ann Broer and Leslie B., along with their wives, Kathy and Linda, were featured on the Phil Donohue Show. Mary Ann and Kathy went on to appear on several local talk shows sponsored by Group W. We were overwhelmed with 600+ inquiries as a result of that show; a mere pittance in comparison to the over 2500 inquiries that followed the later Donohue show in 1987!

Yes, outreach was one of the greatest developments in Chi Chapter in the '80's. Led by Naomi and Eve, these two have appeared on several local and National Television talk shows, and countless hundreds of guest appearances at colleges and universities across the Nation.

But, I feel the single most significant change in the chapter this past decade in the devotion that many of our wives and partners have developed towards Chi. I can remember when only a few wives attended meetings, and then only at private homes, hastening to another corner of the house, away from the crossdressers, only to hold 'bitch' sessions. Today, our ladies are an integral part of the meeting; lending advise, direction, and instruction, along with support, tolerance and understanding.

So, what of 1989. Well, 698 members, prospective members, wives, partners, mothers, daughters, fathers, and other guests attended our twelve monthly meetings and Awards Banquet. Plus another 40+ members and their families participated in the annual chapter picnic. That is an average of 58 people per function. Although down from previous years, it is still indicative of who viable and valuable the chapter continues to be.

Chapter programs continue to be the highlight of the year; fashion shows, self-development sessions hair/wig grooming, poise, make-up and accessorizing, and discussions led by trained professionals were all themes of this past year's meetings. And, for the first time, Chi Chapter sponsored a "Charitable Night" were our donations went to assist the needy.



The chapter hot-line continues to ring literally at all hours of the day and night! HELP! Yes, we need help with the telephone; if you are able to help one or two nights

a month, please let us know so we can forward calls to you. The chapter

mailbox still receives a few inquiries each week, fortunately it has become much easier for me to handle with its decrease and my change in work schedule.

But, now, what of the '90's? What is in store for Chi Chapter in the future? I don't have a crystal ball, so let me



conjecture. I see someone in the paraculture becoming politically active. Perhaps such that

crossdressing will become legal in Illinois. I see several newer members taking a more active role in the chapter; an actual change in the leadership, directing us to new heights. I also see our wives taking an active role in the leadership of the chapter!

Of course, I can see more in public relations as we appear on more talk shows, both radio and television. I see a more productive outreach program that will include a panel discussion at a major therapeutic conference. And, finally, I can see me 'faxing' newsletters to all of our members!

And, yes, I see one last item: our members continuing to submit their chapter dues late, causing me to drop them from the records, only to add them at a later date!

God bless everyone; May the new year be prosperous to you all! May you find love and peace in all your endeavors. And, may the new year be one of health and happiness to us all. See you next month. Keep on coming back!


SPECIAL THANKS MORE NAOMI NOTES.. FROM RACHEL....
