How soon we decline to offer to others the same help that was so freely offered to us before we gained our confidence. And how fast we are willing to walk away and let others do the work. That is one reason I don't believe in dues. To many people dues are a way of saying, I paid my share now what do I get for it. Well, friends, you get your share of nothing, because all any group has to offer is each other and if no one in the group is willing to give themselves then the group has nothing to offer. The words of JFK are as true today as they were when he said them (with a minor change). Ask not what a group can do for you but what YOU can do for the group, because without your willingness to help, and be a part of it, there can be no organization.

We also want to announce the birth of a New Organization, NGA, National Gender Alliance. It will attempt to pick up the pieces of GGA and start anew. She doesn't plan to purchase the "Phoenix" but will try to begin putting out a national news letter, hopefully bi-monthly at first, starting around September. She is offering a membership dues of \$15 for the rest of 1986 in the hopes of raising some funds to get this thing off the ground. She plans to maintain the same values, ideas, and goals of 66A.

I know many of you are saying we don't really need a national organization. Several of the clubs have done fine without being a part of a national group and the same question keeps coming back. If on the other hand you really are doing well as a group then you should be asking "What do we have to offer to the national group?" "How can our being part of it make it stronger?" The International Foundation for Gender Education, which is a by product of Tiffany Club and TV/TS Tapestry, has also been formed. It is a Non-Profit corporation of the state of Mass. and is also offering chapter status to other organizations. As a registered corporation, however, there are a number of requirements which must be met in order to be a chapter. I suggest you look over the IFGE's constitution and if you meet the requirements, you may want to join them. You can be a chapter of both organization if you want to be.

Reports I've heard about the "Be All You Want To Be" weekend all agree that it was a big success as was the P-Town outing. Thanks to all the groups who get together to put on these wonderful weekend. Each one, seems to offer a little something different and that says a lot for the people that plan them.

I've been invited to speak to the volunteers who answer the phones for The Switchboard. I'll be doing that on the first Sunday of August to tell them a little about Cross-Port and cross-dressing.

Finally, I've been accused of not making it "Very Clear" that wives and girlfriend are welcomed, encouraged and wanted at the meetings. I must plead guilty, not because they are not welcomed but because until recently none of our wives wanted to be involved with the group. For those of us who are married, having our wives involved with our dressing and coming to the meetings has always been our hope. The one thing we have said is that we would not try to have two separate meeting going at the same time, one for wives and one for cross-dressers. Everyone is together at the same meeting. We have had a wife or two come to the meetings as well as a couple of other woman who were there for other reasons. I encourage you to come! Get involved! Write an article! As Uncle Sam says, "WE WANT YOU! ".
