Rick Gerharter is a San Francisco-based freelance photojournalist who has been documenting the LGBT communities since 1987. His work has appeared in numerous international and national publications, most regularly in the weekly newspaper, the *Bay Area Reporter*. His work is featured in the books: *Out in the Castro: desire, promise, activism; Witness the Love: stories from the heart of the AIDS epidemic; Gay by the Bay;* and *Out in America: a portrait of gay and lesbian life*. His work also appears in numerous other books, videos and publications.
