The Continued Confessions of an Irishman in a Dress

A lot has been written concerning telling people about your crossdressing. I am no expert, but I have a bit of practical experience and I hope that someone will possibly gain something from my experience.

First of all, I have gone through three major purges in the last seven years. I have looked at my self many times and felt that I must be sick. I felt I looked stupid, silly, sad. I hated myself because I had a large portion of my personality that I had to hide from even my closest friends. They never really knew the full me. After the third major purge (and there had been countless minor purges as well), when I had disposed of hundreds of dollars worth of clothes and other female type materials in the belief that the desire would go away, I found that within a week or two I was purchasing things again.

I decided that this was not going to go away. I had read all the books I could find and I had talked to a few professionals. I knew more about the conditions associated with crossdressing than any of the professionals that I talked with, so I knew enough to accept that it was time to accept myself, enjoy it and perfect it. I'm not going to bore you with how I did this, but I will bore you with the reasons why I told some people about my crossdressing and how I told them.

The first person that I selected was an old girl friend. She is a very liberal person, she has an

engineering degree and an MBA and she has had no family since she was a teenager. She has seen a big chunk of the real world, has lived in New York City for two years and has shared an apartment with a gay male for a year. (Some people might say she was a bit of a fag-hag). We were really quite close and we both shared an absence of family in our lives. She had often used me as a solid shoulder when she needed one.

When I told her, she immediately decided that I must be gay and then she just started talking about her money problems again. She was very surprised, she said she would have never suspected me of all the people that she knows. (How often you will hear this, we are almost overly defensive and secretive when we keep our ourselves in the closet).

The moral of this story is, you really can not predict the people who will accept it and the people who will never understand it. When we mention it these days, I tell her how I am enjoying my self, getting out and being me. She is very happy that I can do this but she still can not understand how a man can crossdress and not be gay. Incidentally, she does not want to see me dressed.

The second victim that I selected was a mere male. I decided that, looking at a worst case, if anything should ever happen to me (like a run in with the law for instance), it would be a good idea to have one friend who could help me in times of crises and without having to deal with the shock of meeting Renee for the first time.

A lot of you will have a chance to meet this friend, he is the one that is going to give the Nu-Skin demonstration in Columbus and

has given the demonstration in Cincinnati. Fred is a little bohemian anyway so the news did not upset him. His only experience of this sort was with a personal friend who used to get beaten up by her husband and this same wife beater enjoyed wearing women's underwear. I had a little bit of work to do in order to break the mind set of 'hear crossdresser, think pervert'.

It helped a lot when he met the wonderful people in Cincinnati, thank you, you lot for being yourselves. Mind you, a little incident in Perkins that involved the police and someone who comes to the meetings but refuses to wear a name tag, did nothing for the P.R. But up to that point, Fred was ready to hop into bed with her anyway. He could not believe that she was anything but a girl that likes to show off and loves attention (enough said).

Fred also said, of all the people that he knew I would have been the last person he would have ever suspected to be a CD. Fred had the balls to take Renee down to the Grapevine for a beer before he met other CDs. He arrived, took me out, and acted as relaxed as if he had had a rattlesnake out on a date, but he did it. I know very few men that could do that. Fred is very comfortable with who he is. He is able to show some traits that may be considered feminine in our culture and he is not afraid to do it. A lot of us, when we are regular guys will not do this, as we are acting macho and fitting in with society's rules.

Then I told my roommate. I had been sharing a house with a young couple. She was still a student, a very young 23 year old. I had a lock on the trusty closet and sometimes you could feel the tension in the house. It was a

horrible place to live — the quality of life was very low and I had really gotten myself into a horrible rut. Then Pat got a job in Chicago. God is good, thank you God. Sheryl and I sat down and agreed to work to make each other more comfortable and within a few days life was beautiful. Within a few weeks it was like we had been friends all of our lives. So I decided that it was to truly enjoy my self and live the way I really wanted. Telling Sheryl would do one of two things; result in a reaction that would make me leave and move on, or give her opportunity to accept it and life would be even more beautiful.

One Saturday morning, I sat her down and handed her a piece of paper that said something like: I Sheryl promise to never reveal to any person other than Peter ... the secret that he shared with me on (date) at (address). He in return will always be willing to discuss this secret at any time I may wish, that is convenient to both parties. I understand that this agreement carries no legal liability (She loves money more than anything in the world and the thought that she might lose any amount of money for any reason would have blown the whole deal, so this escape clause was necessary)

I had two copies and a place for each of us to sign. I told her that it would explain a lot about some of my mysterious movements and it would make life in the house even more comfortable. She was terrified. She said "You're not going to tell me that you want to run around the house naked are you?" I assured her I was not and she very hesitantly signed the forms.

It was worth it. Her reaction was really marvelous. She said that she thought it was a

compliment to women that any man would want to look like a woman. She has given me clothes and she wants to take me shopping. It is our little secret to enjoy and she sees all the advantages of having a girl friend in the house — I hear all the problems. The first time she met Renee, she rushed up and gave her a hug. She never gave Peter any hugs! She even gave me her good purse because she did not like mine. She is a great critic and advisor.

It could have gone the other way. She is young and has not been out in the big bad world. She might have totally flipped, labelled me as pervert and made my life a hell. I took a calculated risk based on the knowledge that she had grown to trust me and used me a someone to tell her problems to in the past. Even when life in the house was uncomfortable, we often went for walks together and I would patiently listen to her. I don't think that anyone had ever taken the time to listen to her before, so I had earned some major brownie points for something I like to do and can do reasonably well — I listen. It's actually relatively easy yet very few people ever try to do it.

So, to sum up, let me try and give my two cents worth of analysis.

1. Our good friend Gina once said to me, "Telling people gets easier and easier". Take a warning from this — it is true. Only tell someone if there is some identifiable advantage to be gained for either party, like if your wife is going to divorce you because she is sure that you are seeing another woman.

2. Do not tell a female friend and expect that she will be

delighted and want to take you shopping and dress you up. She likes you as a boy, she is comfortable with you as a boy and she has no desire to turn you into a girl. If she does, she is possibly kinky.

3. Remember that you have been trying to accept this for most of your life. If it has taken you this long, it is most likely going to take your friend a little while to understand what you are saying, never mind trying to accept you.

4. Don't ever expect a good reaction. Everybody carries around a bunch of problems of their own. The last thing in the world they want are more problems.

5. Be ready for that person to tell at least one other person about this piece of NEWS in strictest confidence. Be ready for that person to tell at least one other person — and on and on. It's hot, it's different and it's even got a touch of sex and scandal buried in it. People can't keep that sort of news in. Thanks Yvonne for this point, I would have not seen it.

So, there you are, that's my two cents worth. It has certainly improved the quality of my life. I consider myself very lucky, it could have gone very sour on me. The one thing that drove me is the knowledge that the one constant in this ever changing world is Renee. She is here to stay and I have to make room for her. She's not going anywhere except out on Saturday nights, so I better get used to it.

News to Amuse

From the **Los Angeles Times** - In the wake of a veteran fire captain's decision to undergo a sex change, officials have been conducting sensitivity sessions throughout the Los Angeles Fire Department to help the captain's colleagues cope.

Capt. Michele Kaemmerer, who was hired by the department 22 years ago as Michael J. Kaemmerer, said the department had been supportive of her decision to be known henceforth as a woman and to remain a commander.

"(Fire) Chief (Donald O.) Manning has been fabulous," Kaemmerer said. "I'm glad to be here... This is my career, and I love it."

Fire officials confirmed that ranking officers and a department psychologist have been counseling personnel at the captain's station and at other fire houses in the city to make sure that the transition is as smooth as possible.

Kaemmerer, who is on vacation, is commander of one of three platoons that work rotating shifts at the fire house.

The men in Kaemmerer's platoon, who asked that their names not be used, all said they were glad to be working for the captain and had no objections.

"It's his own thing," one of the said. "Whatever he wants to do, that's OK with me. ..."

"Everybody knows about it," another member of the platoon said. "It's the kind of thing everyone talks about. But I don't have any trouble with it, and I don't know anyone who has."

From the **Chicago Tribune** - Pat Foster lives in Park Ridge and has an accounting business in Chicago. But once a month he dresses in women's clothing to pose as Mary Ann Foster, host of "The Church of Human Kindness," a suburban cable television show about transvestites and transsexuals.

"There's nothing wrong with a male who comes to terms with his femininity," Foster said. "It's just the way people look at it." And look at it, people do.

Foster, whose show airs on TCI of Illinois Inc.'s public access channels in the northwest suburbs, is one of a new breed of television enthusiasts, the producer of home-spun programming for cable TV systems.

For people like Foster, host (hostess?) of the transvestite show, it's a way to make a point. "We're very nice people," he said.

Foster's talk show is designed to enlighten viewers about a variety of issues, he added, not just about transvestites and transsexuals. Other topics have included freedom of religion and metaphysics.

From the **Cincinnati Enquirer** - The Enquirer asked readers to design a new image for Andre Agassi as part of the 1991 Thriftway ATP Championship. One of the Enquirer's favorites (which they reprinted in full color) was Agassi dressed in a purple corselet, garters, heels and fishnet stockings. It was turned in by an eleven year old as a Rocky Horror Picture Show theme. As it turns out, about 5 percent of the entries (41 out of 831) were of Agassi in drag.

From the **Indy Star** - Women who like to change their nail polish

often, but who don't like the time and trouble involved, will find an intriguing item in the new Avon catalog: nail polish that peels off on purpose! It's called "Quick Change Nail Color", and according to Avon marketers, it's the closest thing to "no fuss" nail polish that there is.

It goes on more easily than traditional nail color — it requires neither a base coat nor a top coat. And, if taken off within 24 hours of application, it can be peeled off in a single strip, without the use of remover. "Quick Change" comes in eight shades and costs \$2.99 for a half ounce bottle. Some Tips on Voice

Yvonne Gordon, a speech and language pathologist formerly with a gender program in San Diego, gave a talk on May 11 about speaking like a woman. She said changing your voice is much harder than changing your appearance. Yet it is crucial to passing. Some TS's can do anything but the voice, and because of that cannot convincingly make the leap of persona change. However, the change can be accomplished by almost everyone if they get a lot of instruction and are motivated. Here are the basic principles:

Pitch - males can raise their pitch to the bottom of the female range, but if they do it wrong, it sounds squeaky and artificial, and

the stress can cause nodules on the vocal cords and other serious problems. It is very important to relax the voice and to avoid strain yet still get acceptable pitch and this takes practice.

Breath - Women use more breath than men. Breathiness helps protect the vocal cords as well as helping to sound more feminine.

Tone Focus - The chest is used prominently for resonance by men, whereas women use the neck, face and cheek. Bring the sound out through the face and eliminate chest resonance as much as possible.

Intonation - Use a lilt in your voice. Boys growing up learn to limit their range, which becomes a habit which may be hard to break. Women play with their voice and are more expressive in all ways, including moving their lips and face more when they speak.

Gestures - Men limit their gestures. Moving the body when you speak is very feminine. Women's body posture is also more relaxed.

Content - Men tend to talk about things which are abstract or impersonal (urban events, sports, problem solving) whereas women frequently talk about their emotions, their bodies and relationships to other people (sex relationships, families, health, weight, food, clothing).

Relation to the Other - Women tend to be non-assertive and more caring. A woman asks for something; she doesn't demand it. She is apologetic at the slightest possibility someone's feelings might have been trampled on. (If a man bumps into her in the supermarket, it is she who apologizes.) She spends more time

listening to what other say and asking what they think.

To work on the above requires careful observance of other women, which can be done without a therapist. The therapist serves to give a reality check, since it is often hard to get good feedback from anyone else. Developing a woman's voice takes from two months to two years depending on the amount of support you have and how closely you work with your significant others.

As some of you may already know, the Court System is a fund raising part of many Gay organizations. In many parts of the country, a local Gay group will have a formal ball with all the proceeds going to help some worthy cause, like "aids" research. At this ball, they crown an Emperor and an Empress to reign over the court for a year. For the most part, everyone who attends this event are gay, and male, so all the girls are really boys in drag. In most cities, this is a very formal event. Long evening gowns and black ties are a must. Many couples arrive in limos, and make their entrance on a red carpet while music is played. Some of the more famous "Balls" would be like "The Night of a Thousands Gowns", which is held every fall in New York. I know many CD's in other cities who attend these balls, and I have always heard good things about them.

A few years ago while in San Francisco, I had the privilege of having dinner with Kay Gould and Jose Sarria. It just so happens that Jose was the very first Empress of the Court, when it was first conceived, some thirty years ago. After listening to Kay and Jose talk for several hours, I knew that I just had to make it to a coronation some day. I've always wanted to attend one of these events, but the distance and expense have always been to great.

One of the reasons I bring this up to you, is because Cincinnati now has a recognized Court. By recognized, I mean they are accepted by the other 55 Courts in the United States and Canada. They adopted the name, the Imperial Sovereign Queen City

Court of the Buckeye Empire, or I.S.Q.C.C.B.E. for short.

With a recognized Court, this means they may have a "Ball", and that's just what they have in mind. Everyone, and this means you, are invited to attend the first ever such event to be held in the Greater Cincinnati area.

The date is set for Saturday, August 17, 1991. The place is the Riverfront Travelodge in Newport, Ky. Seating starts at 6:00 PM, and the coronation begins at 7:00 PM. This will probably last until approximately midnight. They expect guests to come from all over the country, with many other Emperors and Empresses in attendance, each making their own exalted appearance. The evening festivities include Female Impersonators from all over, who do their best numbers to entertain the court and from what I understand, everyone has a super time.

The cost is \$15.00 in advance, and \$20.00 the day of the show, for general admission on a non-reserve, first come first serve basis. Later that night, they have a Victory Brunch at the hotel for another \$10.00, if you are hungry, or just want to stay out later. A cash bar will be available for those over 21.

For more information on the coronation, contact Roger [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]. I am already making plans to attend, and I'm sure that many other girls from Crossport will too. If you call the Crossport hot line, we will try to inform you on what's happening.

On another note, you may want to purchase the next issue of Playboy. Reports have it that the world famous sex change from England, Tula, has posed for the magazine. The U.S. version doesn't have as many pictures as it's foreign counterpart, but I understand there is a long story of her life and the struggles that transsexuals must face.

For the past few years she has been fighting an up hill battle against her country in trying to get the law changed that says Transsexuals may not change the gender of their birth certificate. Much like the state of Ohio, she may not legally marry a man and her rights of anonymity are nonexistent.

How ironic, anyone in this country that is born with an impairment not only can usually find government assistance monetarily speaking, but there are laws passed that protect their rights. In some cases, like those who are confined to wheelchairs, the law forces you to accommodate these people by means of easy egress at your expense for the mere chance that if someone would want to come to your place of business, they could without barriers.

Unfortunately, Transsexuals, like most gay people, have no rights. Hopefully we can hang on the coattails of the Gay Community as they fight the long political battles ahead.

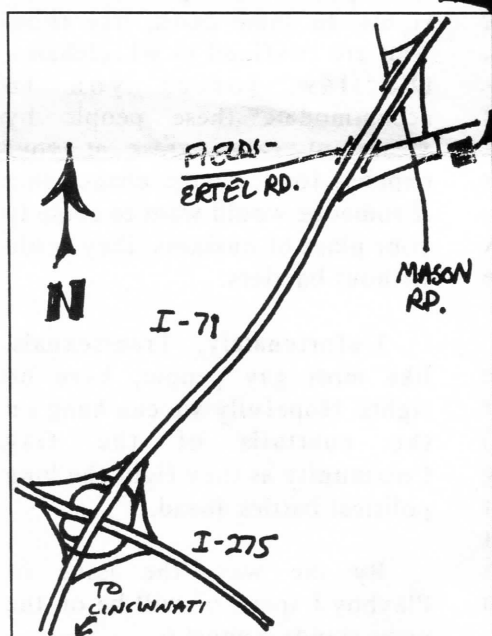
