BRADFORD COLLEGE STUDENTS SUPPORT TRANSGENDERED SPEAKER

On April 5, 1995, more than 100 students (20% of the student population) occupied the main academic building on campus at Bradford College in Haverhill, Massachusetts to protest the administration's relusal to allow transgender activist Leslie Feinberg to deliver their 1995 commencement address. The senior class had asked Feinberg to be their keynote speaker. The administration refused to allow Feinberg to speak.

In a move to garner support from the Gender Community and the community at large, the students sent out the following on the Internet

"STUDENTS APPEAL FOR NATIONAL HELP TO WIN TRANSGENDER GRADUATION SPEAKER

"We, the seniors at Bradford College in Haverhill, Massachusetts, would like to alert the national community to an issue of bigotry and oppression that we find unconscionable. Leslie Feinberg, transgender activist and author of the novel *Stone Bitch Blues*, was our class nominee for commencement speaker. School President Joseph Short vetoed Leslie Feinberg's right to sepak, offering faulty and offensive reasons for his decision.

"We are calling on the national (and international) community to respond and join our voices in demanding that Leslie Feinberg's voice be heard at our graduation ceremony."

If so, you may want to tell Ingersoll about it Discrimination experiences in the workplace, school, in medical or therapeutic settings, restaurants, stores and other public places are being sought by Ingersoll as follow-up to Ingersoll's "Response to Hatred"

As bizarre as it may seem, opposition groups are beginning to say, "There's *not really*: any discrimination against "these" people -- they are already protected *too much*?" (Italics mine) The purpose of collecting stories of bigotry and discrimination is to counteract these fraudulent claims by anti-civil rights groups.

If you have a story to tell, write it down and put it in the suggestion box or give it to your facilitator to pass on to Pat Butler, Executive Director. We will type your story out and present all of them to Hands Off Washington (Washington Citizens for Fairness). If you have a story and don't want to take the time to write it down, make arrangements to get together with Pat and he will take your oral account and transfer it to the printed page.

To balance the discrimination against us, I want to note how many qualified, intelligent people are coming forward as activists and volunteers. The best thing we can do in tunes like this is to take care of ourselves. But if you have a desire to be part of the new activism, please don't forget we always need volunteers and people with ideas.
