Dr Gee's wife Margaret, was granted a decree nisi earlier this month and is now staying with relatives on the Isle of Man with her sons, aged eight, six and four. Dr Gee, a doctor of music, quit as organist at St Nicholas's Anglican church, Wallasey, Merseyside, after she claimed the vicar, the Rev. John Bentley, told her: 'Resign or be sacked.' Tysterday Dr Gee, who is in her early thirties, packed her belongings into a hired van after a court official served an injunction granted to Mrs Gee to leave their home in Sun-ningdale Road, Wallasey. Shock for parishioners Dr Gee said of her meeting with the vicar : 'I was shocked and upset by his attitude. 'Only a week earlier he had called a meeting of all the church women's groups to explain my situation. He said he would support me. 'But then he called me to his home and said I would have to go. Brownies. The former organist said her sons might eventually know her as 'Auntie'. Mr Bentley refused to comment on the resignation yesterday, but a spokesman for Chester Anglican Diocese said: "The organist at St Nicholas's was asked to leave in an amicable manner."
