# CONVENTION UP-DATE



For those of you who do not Know, the 1st International TV/TS Convention is scheduled for March 4 to March 9, 1987 at the Ramada Inn O'Hare in Chicago. The convention is meant to be educational for the TV/TS community, the people who serve us and those interested in and affected by us. Only those who understand the nature of the convention, and are willing to comply with our security and code of conduct requirements (good manners, common sense, etc.) are welcome. The hotel is out by the airport and we will be taking over a large portion of the facility.

The Cost is \$50/night/person double and \$100/night single for the Hotel. The convention registration fee is \$150/person or \$225/M-F couple. Discounts of 20% for payment by Oct. 6, 1986 and 10% for payment by Jan. 5, 1987 are being offered for convention registration. This includes all sessions, meals, reception, shows and the banquet. Most of the planned activities run from Thursday evening to Sunday morning.

Since I am on the steering committee representing Cross-Port, I will be receiving the information and keeping all informed. If any of you have ever met Merissa from the "Tiffany Club", you know that she really has her act together and you can be certain that the convention will be run very well. ## Mew York - Mew York

If you are planning a trip to New York City in the near future there are a lot of things for your Femee-Self to see and do.

First on your list should be a visit to Muriel Olive's Fem Fashions at 157 W. 57th Street (phone 212-582-6823. Muriel is a warm, compassionate, talented woman who works almost exclusively with cross-dressers, and performs a wide range of services. Her most important service is counseling which she provides in an array of areas like clothing, makeup and deportment. But she also has a wide array of merchandise which includes books, clothing, jewelry, wigs etc. You can purchase merchandise in person or by mail.

If you plan to see Muriel, you should call early. She sees people only by appointment, and is generally booked about a week in advance. Her charge is \$60 for two hours or \$35 for an hour. She is generous with her time, and will probably give you more time than she charges you for. Her makeup sessions run about two hours, and are very informative. You should plan to spend at least three hours if you can spare the time and the money.

The second place on your list should be <u>Lee Brewster's Mardi Gras Boutique</u> at 565 10th Ave. (2nd floor- phone 212-947-7713 Lee sells merchandise including wigs, books, magazines, lingerie, makeup, clothes and prostheses. The place is large and the merchandise is plentiful. In addition, the staff is courteous and helpful. Lee's is open from 10 am to 6 pm, Monday through Saturday with no appointment necessary.

Michael Salems is at 300 E. 46th Street (phone 202-371-6871). An appointment is necessary and he doesn't keep regular hours so if you plan to see this place be sure to call ahead.

Once you are all dressed up you'll need some place to go. There is a place at 165 W. 47th Street called <u>Casa Daria</u> and is reputed to be a TV/TS hangout, but is not highly recommended. A very good night spot is the <u>Greenwich Pub</u> at 73 8th Ave. (phone 212-777-1800). A large number of TVs and TS's congregate there. On a weekend evening about 40% or more of the patrons may be cross-dressed.

Finally, another place with a good reputation is <u>Christopher's</u> which is on <u>Christopher Street between Hudson and Bleaker Streets</u>.

Muriel Olive can also put you in touch with one of the local TV/TS chapters of which there is a sizeable number of people that get together fairly regularly.
