SAVE OUR SPACE

FIERCE! founded the Save Our Space Campaign to counter the displacement and criminalization of TLGBTSQQ youth at the Christopher Street pier and in Manhattan's West Village. The Pier, located on the fringe of the West Village, has historically been the only safe public space for many homeless and low-income TLGBTSQQ youth of color to find each other and build community. In an attempt to counter the state and citysanctioned redevelopment and gentrification of the Pier, the Save Our Space (SOS) campaign was launched to reclaim the Pier as a public space that should be controlled by and for us!



FIERCE! has focused our campaign on the oppressive "Quality of Life" policies which were put into place by former Mayor Giuliani. The laws gave police the authority to treat petty offenses such as panhandling, public urination, loitering with the intent to prostitute, and homelessness as worthy of prosecution.

Through a mix of youth-led organzing and activist strategies - including direct action, media advocacy, street visibility through art/activism, and testifying at public forums - FIERCE! has been able to change the terms of the public debate about quality of life and public safety in the West Village so that the voices of merchants and residents, politicians and police, are not the only ones that are heard.

POLITICAL EDUCATION & TRAININGS



FIERCE! organizes regular political education and organizing skills building workshops open to all of our constituency. FIERCE! continues its efforts to raise the level of political and social consciousness of TLGBTSQQ youth as a means to strengthen our organizing efforts.

Our skills-building trainings including topics such as campaign development, direct action tactics, pratical skills for community organizing, and media advocacy. Our political education training topics have included histories of social change movements, policing in the queer community, as well as a series of know your rights trainings. FIERCE! organizes against the injustices of the criminal "justice", housing, employment, education, and healthcare systems.

COP History FIERCE! was founded in March of 2000 by a group of TLGBTSQQ youth, mostly of color, filling a city-wide gap and becoming NYC's only community organizing project for TLGBTSQQ youth. We founded FIERCE! out of a sense of urgency that the collective voices of TLGBTSQQ youth be heard in New York City. Fueled by direct experiences of racial, economic, gender, and age oppression, members of FIERCE! have been working to build bridges between movements for justice. Already, FIERCE! has worked to turn police violence against TLG-BTSQQ youth into a public issue and have advocated for alternatives to incarceration that don't subject TLGBTSQQ youth of color to the racism, transphobia, and homophobia of prisons and juvenile detention centers.

FENCED OUT

Fenced OUT documents the struggle of TLGBTS-QQ youth of color to save the Christopher Street Pier from redevelopment



and gentrication. While researching the history of the pier, FIERCE! members discovered past generations of queer peoples' fight for use of public spaces at Christopher Street and the piers. To date we have reached over 3,000 people in New York City and nationwide.

FIERCE! offers serveral workshops in conjunction with our Fenced OUT screenings, including TLGB-TSQQ youth organizing against gentrification and displacement and TLGBTSQQ youth of color and the Prison-Industrial Complex.

We have also developed a survey to document TLGBT-SQQ youth of color and homeless youth's experience with police harassment

and racial and gender profiling. So far we have collected hundreds of surveys.
