Although 1-677 lost at the polls, the gender community won a m victory Never before has a state-wide measure included protection be on gender identity. And this inclusion didn't come from a 'radical' gre but rather from a mainstream organization which has attained access to Wednesdays in December: TS Group (Referral Only) 7:30-9:30 PM highest members in State office. This access wasn't gained easily an wasn't gained recently. We all owe a great deal of gratitude to Mai All Fridays in December: TV/TS Support Group (Open) 8-111 PM Botzer, Activist and Founder of Ingersoll Gender Center.

Marsha has never been one to toot her own horn. She doesn't write artiabout her accomplishments or publish position papers on her views. W Marsha has done for the gender community over the past 20 years, she done in the name of Ingersoll. Over that time, Marsha has quietly gai access to very influential people. She worked many house over m months talking one-on-one with past governor Mike Lowry, pregovernor Gary Locke, members of the State legislature, and influer member in the GLBT community. Only someone with 20 years of hist and experience could have pulled of f what Marsha did. And the battle SUNDAY, DECEMBER 7, 1997 much more uphill than any of us realize. Everyone feared that inclusio SUNDAY, DECEMBER 7, 1997 gender identity would spell sure failure at the polls.

Well, 1-677 did fail at the polls. But in the aftermath, analysts are blar a conservative voter turnout due to 1-676 and 1-685, not the gen community. That spells likely inclusion of gender identity in fur mitiatives and legislation aimed at attaining fair and equal rights for State citizens.

Please remember to thank Marsha for accomplishing what no one elsi the gender community could have achieved.

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COMING TO INGERSOLL By Linda

We arrive at the door of the Center from all over the country. Many of started on the journey many years ago, some just last week. Some come for ovisit, others find a home. We all share one thing in common. The need to expressive openly and without fear. Being Transgendered is not easy for most of and the Ingersoll Center is a place that accepts and supports all of the rich divers in the gender community.

A year or so ago, I walked up the few short steps of the walk to the seclud building, took a deep breath, muttered to myself, "What are you doing, girl?" fixed my makeup and skirt and walked into the Friday night meeting. I had been the meeting the night before to sort of, well, you know, check it out. Denise we the facilitator of the "rap group", a meeting with no apparent structure, whi means she was there being herself. She is a warm, friendly, accepting and not pushy woman. Just the way you would like your sister to be if she isn't already lit that.

Someone said "Hi" and invited me to join them. A couple of members we chatting with Denise about going "full-time," whatever that meant (maybe the were students!) and some chatted about the drive up from Tacoma, how their wive were 'dealing with it' and life in general. I am sure the topics were all ve important to each person at the time, but what seems the most important to it about the night was the feeling of safety and belonging I felt with these stranger. They understood and I hadn't said anything.

Personally, I didn't get to this first meeting easily I had been in therapy off are on since I was 24 -- A total six years attempting to deal with, avoid, rationalize, in talk about, and generally being miserable most of the time about my gend discomfort. The counselor I was seeing, a truly wonderful woman, had recognize my gender dysphoria about two years before. She had suggested that I might was to call Ingersoll Gender Center and maybe seek a gender specialist. Well, I call four times over some months and listened to the message. Finally left my phor number and someone called me back later that week. They were very helpfi answered my questions and invited me to an open meeting.

Finally, I went directly from work. I got lost and tried to call Ingersoll from phone booth at the International House of Pancakes near the Center. Surprisingly Marsha Botzer answered, and gave my directions and when I asked if I could comeven if I was so late. She warmly said, "Of course, come on over." I have bee coming to Ingersoll ever since.

That was 14 months ago. I have been to many meetings, and now talk about going "full-time" soon myself. The Center continues to amaze and support me along with so many others with a full spectrum of gender resources. I have met so many wonderful men and women who are, to some degree or another just like me Remembering that "Birds of a feather flock together." Many of them even becom like the Beautiful Phoenix, transform themselves, and fly away to new lives, self accepting, courageous and free.


