# "Queer is Closet"

"Queer is anti-homosexual. The Queer community does not exist. Queer is our enemy, when I hear 'Queer' I reach for the Kalashnikov"

A nice little reminder of the 'queerphobes' out there. This is exactly the kind of comment you expect from fascists everywhere, he is just one of those sad identity politics freaks that has'n't moved on, what has he been doing all this time?

This and other articles at the time got in a right little state over this word 'queer':



SOME (queer bisexuals) saw it as a way to identify as those attempting to bridge the gap between homo and heterosexuals.

SOME (media types) saw it as 'political', 'contemporary' and above all it looked good on your titles! say no more.

SOME (gay'queers') saw it as meaning homo's, fags and gays NOT bisexuals, fag hags and fruit flies.

SOME (regular queers) saw it as anyone who is different, not conforming to the norm - attacking class, race, patriarchy.... ∴ Queer hetero's are possible.

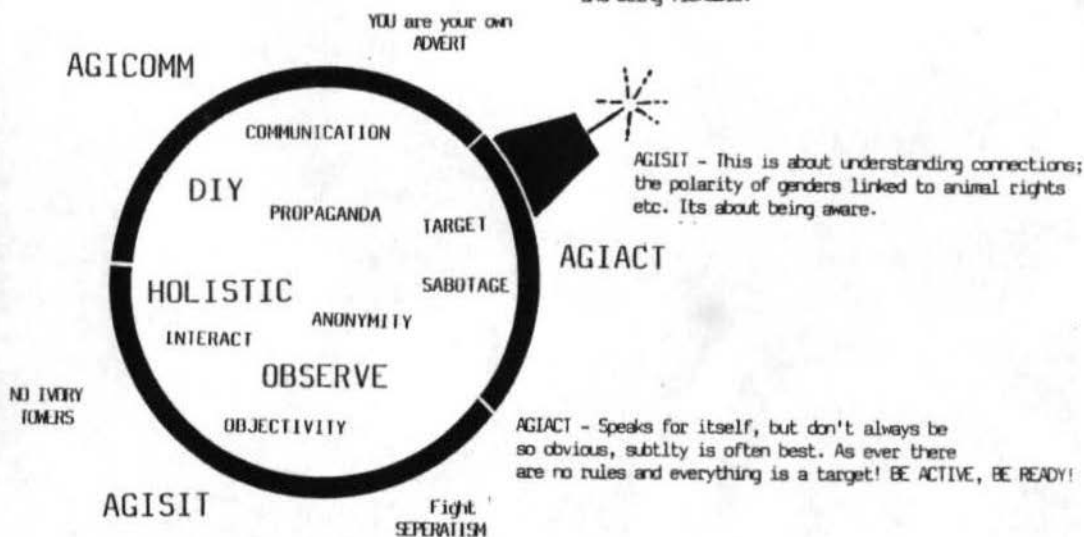
SOME (Traditional queers) saw it as a reminder of what hetero's thought of us and how as a term of abuse it could be turned around on them and used to empower us.

A worry the 'gay community' apparently has is that by identifying as Queer in the widest sense then you make Lesbians & Gays invisible again. Also that this movement away from identity politics removes our base that we used to demand rights. but isn't it time we moved away from all this fiddling around the edges, which is what human rights groups consistently do. do we submerge ourselves in a micro-identity; constantly creating little sub-groups that we can become a member of. Being Lesbian or gay now is restrictive and describes very little - claims by some gay activists that we should only (as gays) campaign in for example bisexual rights for the gay part of the identity and not the straight side is out of step, naïve, and bloody laughable

So where does all this leave us, well I'm just a regular Queer but I really do have to ask myself - is it possible to be Queer? to disconnect yourself from society, can we live our utopian Queer dreams - can we get by? Sometimes you can be Queer by connecting to punk, anarchist, sexperv, underground and alternative scenes; whilst of course recognising their restrictive nature. It is a basic lesson to learn that they will all ultimately fail you since they cannot escape the influence of the dominant culture's ethos of restricted thinking and separatism. So to get on with things, you've been absorbing all this stuff and there is a big hole, so maybe it's time to look to yourself (again), as they say "you are your own revolution". So let's chew on a few thoughts that should be crossing your mind on a daily basis, that if you're still trying to be Queer and haven't thrown up your hands in despair or turned into an old cynic.

# THE QUEER SPHERE:

AGICOMM - This is all about thinking what messages you are sending out. Its about knowing every side of the arguement; showing conviction and being flexible.



All this is built up around 'the self' - MIND, BODY & SPIRIT, your politics, aspirations or dreams will never develop unless you sort this area out. Illness, frustration, selfishness, arrogance, impatience and ignorance will hinder all you hopes and you alone will be responsible for the continuation of all that which you supposedly fight against.

All this will be obvious to a lot of people and I again wonder who am I aiming at with this Zine, I guess I just hope it hits home to one person who hadn't thought of this or that. For example do I have to remind people to GENDERFUCK your brains out? I'm not talking about traditional 'drag' ideas, mostly I find them stuck in a simple, if not conceited timewarp - let's get this masculine/femine stereotype sorted out please! Someone told me to use the word 'se' instead of 'he' or 'she', maybe if we thought more about ideas like this things would move on. Lets forget this 'cross' dressing and concentrate more on 'crash' dressing, because don't get me wrong, personal expression like this can be a powerful form of AGICOM.

I also want to mention something about reliance. My basic advise is avoid it because you will never be disappointed by others letting you down. However we're human and the support of friends cannot be underestimated, as indeed your support of others is partly what being Queer is all about. However reliance can lead to apathy and sloth, and this my friends is exactly what our oppressors use to disempower us, stringing us along like idiots. We rely on thier 'benevolence' for jobs, housing, health, education ... we forget how to live without this and all our 'necessary' possessions - in fact we forget to rely on ourselves and indeed, contrary to what they tell us, they don't want us to .
