His father agreeing to reimburse all parties concerned for any damage their property might have received, Dudley Liddell, aged 16, of Termon ave., who, while dressed in women's apparel the last two weeks, purchased a number of articles of clothing from Pittsburg stores on charge accounts of his sister and sister-in-law, and wore several garments belonging to Mrs. M. D. Hazlett of the Northside, was discharged at a hearing today before Magistrate Edward Dillon at Northside police station.

Information had been made against him by Mrs. Hazlett, but she withdrew it when paid for the clothes Liddell wore. The department store managers also agreed not to make any charges when Liddell's family arranged to pay for the clothes the boy obtained. While masquerading Liddell flirted with a number of prominent Pittsburg men and enjoyed many lunches and dinners at their expense, it is said. Formerly he was a female impersonator on the stage. He was arrested Friday.
