#### FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK

Hello everybody, this isn't Mrs. Norman Maine! (Sorry to disappoint all you Judy Garland fans out there.) This is your General Secretary reporting on the latest developments from the Board of Directors.

At a special meeting, the Board selected two beneficiaries for the 1997 Night of a Thousand Gowns. The Lesbian and Gay Community Services Center Capital Campaign Fund and the AmFAR AIDS/HIV Treatment Directory were chosen from the nominees proposed by the General Membership and the Board. Serious consideration was given to all the nominees, and your input is greatly appreciated. The list was narrowed down to five prospective beneficiaries who were invited to make their presentations to the Board on November 11. After the interviews the Board then considered and discussed each nominee and voted to name these two.

The Center has been our home for many years and the meeting place of 300 hundred other gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and AIDS organizations since 1983. The Capital Campaign was launched publicly at the Center's Garden Party in June 1995, and its purpose is to raise funds to renovate the 152 year old building and add a five story addition, thus doubling the space.

The Center's Capital Campaign allows the Imperial Court of New York to express our ongoing support for the Center, participate in its challenge grant program, and inspire other community organizations to show their monetary support for the Center that we all call "home."

The American Foundation for AIDS Research (AmFAR), founded in 1985, is the nation's leading nonprofit organization dedicated to the support of AIDS research. The AmFAR Treatment Directory is a comprehensive source of information on the latest treatments, medications, access to experimental protocols, patient assistance programs, drug manufacturers, and other resources for people living with AIDS and HIV. It is published biannually, and over 80% of the Treatment Directories are made available at no cost through organizations serving the AIDS community.

These were tough decisions to make, but I think you'll agree that the beneficiaries of the 1997 Night of A Thousand Gowns are ones of which we can all be proud.
