### IFGE CONVENTION 1988

The Second International Foundation for Gender Education Convention will be held February 23-29, 1988 at the Ramada O'Hare Hotel in Chicago. The convention will be an important educational event for the TV/TS community, the people who serve us, and those interested in and affected by us.

There will be a comprehensive program of workshops, seminars, moderated special topic raps and social activities for crossdressers, transsexuals, significant others, helping professionals and members of the general public who wish to learn.

The Convention registration fee is \$175/person, or \$275/M-F couple. Discounts of 10% for payment by January 1, 1988, and 5% for payment by February 10, 1988, are being offered. Registration includes all sessions, receptions, shows, and banquet. Speaker's luncheons at \$10/luncheon. Most planned activities run from Wednesday evening (February 24) to Sunday morning (February 28).

Hotel and airline reservations must be made individually.



## ETVC/SGA TRAGEDY

On September 19th, PATTY FINK, a member of ETVC and SGA, was tragically taken from us by the extreme negligence of a draw bridge operator in Sacramento who was drunk while on duty.

Patty did not attend many of the ETVC meetings, but rather four and a half years ago she helped with the philosophy of ETVC -- That every time you have an event, you have fun; and that ETVC is for all types of people, it's an open group.

At the memorial service on September 26 & 27, over 500 different people attended; only a fraction of the people that Patty touched. Besides ETVC and SGA, Patty led two AA groups, was in ALANON and a children's alcohol and drug group, was a leader in the Sacramento gay community, and the person who started the Sacramento Jazz Festival. Patty truly felt that there was always room to help one more person.

For me, personally, she was a very special lady who helped people in the gender, straight, bi, and gay communities. Even in death she was giving gifts. I and at least one other person were given the gift of emotional release for the first time.

The last time I talked to Patty was on Saturday morning, August 29, for about one hour - we talked about our favorite topic - How to make gender groups grow and prosper.

I would like to take up a collection for Patty and donate it in Patty's name to a group we were both concerned about, the Sacramento Gender Association.
