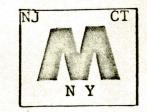

A most enjoyable time is the only way I can summarize the Chapter's May meeting. We had the best attendance yet, new members, more wives and a girlfriend and GG visitor.

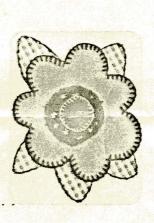

Kitchen Of ... Marlene (NY-314-B), and girlfriend Monica

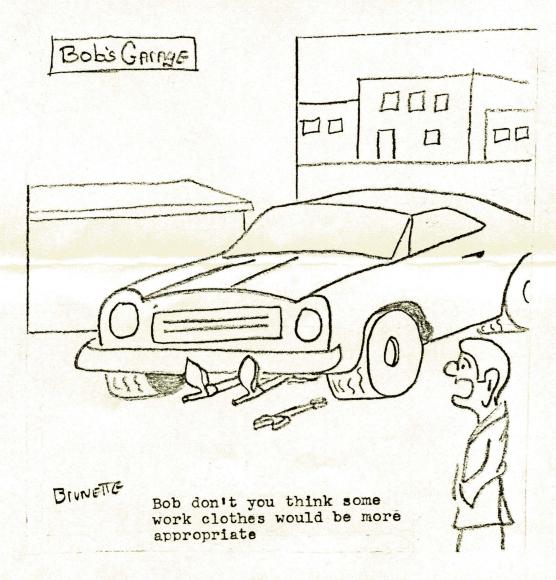
Seafood Gumbo

4 tblsp. butter or margerine, 3 tblsp. flour, 2 onions chopped into two cups, 1 minced garlic clove, 1 12-oz. can of tomatoes, 1 can chicken broth, condensed; 2 cups of water, 1 tblsp. salt, 1 tblsp. Worcestershire souce, 1/4 teaspoon red pepper powder, 1 lb. crabmeat (or 2, 7-oz. cans), 1 pt. oysters (or 3, 7-oz. cans), 2 tblsp. file powder.

Melt butter in a deep dish and add flour over a low heat for 15 minutes; stir until flour turns brown. Stir in onions and the garlic and stir often for about 10 minutes. Add tomatoes, chicken broth, water, salt, Worcestershire souce, and red pepper and cover pot. Simmer for about 15 minutes to mix flavor. Add crab meat and oysters. Do NOT drain from can if use can(s). Cook another 5 minutes till oysters are done. Sprinkle file powder into mix to thicken broth. Serve with white rice or noodles if desired.

Editorial

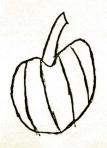
Well, we are not quite yet a year old, but our membership has multiplied fivefold since our first 0.S.J.
