### ETVC

The Social Committee develops social themes and handles event logistics. And the Hostess Committee provides new members with an orientation to ETVC. Anyone who is in a relationship with a gender-challenged person will find support in an active Significant Others Support (SOS) Group, and a Couples Social Group. Both meet monthly. A Poker Social meets on the second Friday of each month.

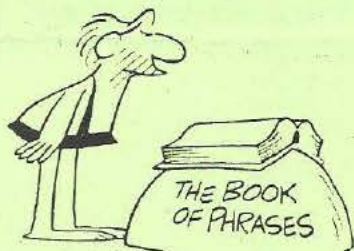

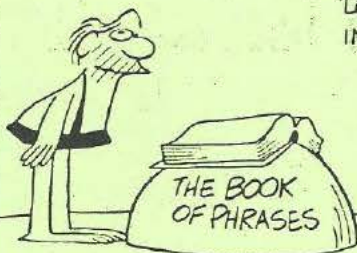

For those of us in ETV, there is another message: organizations cannot and do not exist on the energy of one or two people. Apparently, this was the case with GGA. And when that person has had enough, the "organization" ceases to function.

We are not trying to be cute, polite, or come across as suffering martyrs when we encourage people to step forward and volunteer to do things in ETV. The success we have realized as an organization can be traced directly to the efforts of many people over several years-- all picking up some piece of the work that is done here.

The former members of GGA will reform themselves in some new organizational context or retreat to the closet. Those choices could have been avoided. But they could only have been avoided if each member took a measure of responsibility for the continued success of the organization.
